PORTLAND, Ore.—Great strength is displayed in the mutton and lamb trade. While the arrivals will not be shown until today and will not be weighed until Monday, sales of wool lambs were made in the North Portland yards at \$2. Two loads of fancy stuff to arrive sold at the extreme height of 48 per cent above the previous high mark.

Mutton and lamb supplies continue to dwindle at North Portland. Only 2949 head appeared in the yards during the week's trade and few of these entered the open market.

All doubt that mutton and lamb prices will show an extreme height this season has vanished. Supplies during this year showed a very remarkable decrease at North Portland and the number of animals on feed is comparatively limited.

At \$2.75 for tops the market for swine was firm at North Portland during the week. There was a further sharp decrease in offerings; in fact, there was only a fraction more than the local yards during the week as during the preceding six days.
