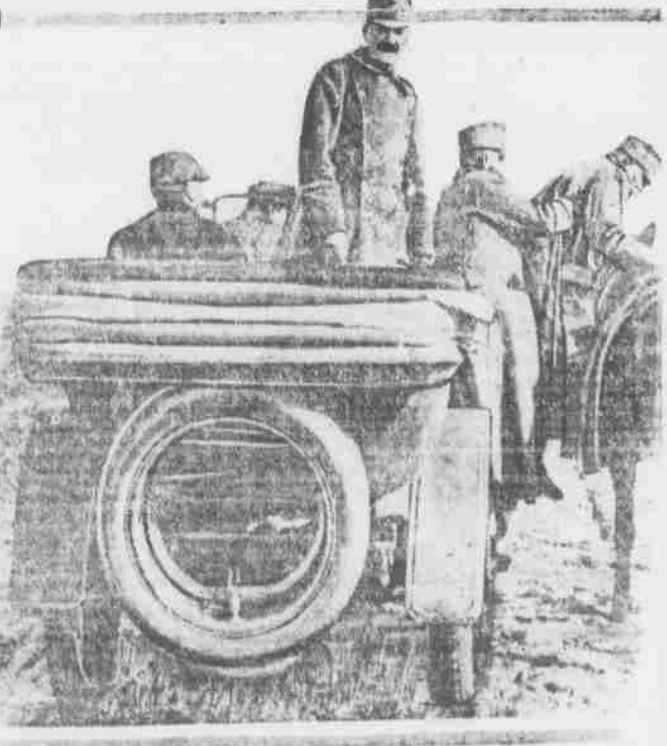

PORTLAND, Ore.—Strength was again prominently displayed in all lines of livestock at North Portland during the day's trading. There was only a fair run of hogs, but the totals were far better than last Tuesday.

General hog market conditions continued strong during the day, but the bulk of the offerings were from the Willamette valley and few real topers were available. One sale was made at \$6.65, or 10c above the previous high mark.
