Hepner Hogs Go to \$6.70 For Top Stuff at Portland

PORTLAND, Ore.—Hepner topped the market for hogs at North Portland during the day's trading and at \$6.70 established a new high record for the present movement. The day's price was easily 10c better than Thursday. While only one load sold during the morning at the extreme value, the purchase of Willamette valley stock at \$6.65 indicated the full strength of the local situation.

There was a rather fair run of swine in the local yards overnight, but sales were made quickly and the market cleaned up early.

Specifications for the state which puts Oregon on an equality with the most progressive states in the union. They became operative at once.

To prevent Oregon from becoming the dumping ground for inferior weighing apparatus, protect the public against inaccurate measure and enable the merchants to procure properly constructed equipment are in brief, the purposes of these specifications.

This result is to be accomplished without unwarranted expense to the business public by making only those specifications retroactive which apply to equipment in use, or held for sale where the public's interest absolutely demands it.

Mr. Buchtel said that probably the most important to the people generally are the specifications that govern the manufacture and use of computing scales. With the view of protecting the merchant against scales of inferior quality and construction numerous specifications have been prescribed.

Under specifications for liquid measures, it is provided that the capacity shall be legibly and permanently indicated on the side of the measure. Milk and cream bottles brought into Oregon must also have their capacity clearly and permanently marked in or on the side.

The soft wood yard stick and the common cloth tape measure are prohibited from use in trade under the specifications.

Jail for Shirkers.

LONDON, Jan. 8.—The text of the military service bill was made public here. The penalty for false statements by men whom the bill affects is imprisonment of not exceeding six months, without hard labor.

Failure to notify the authorities of any change of circumstances is punished by a fine not exceeding \$250.

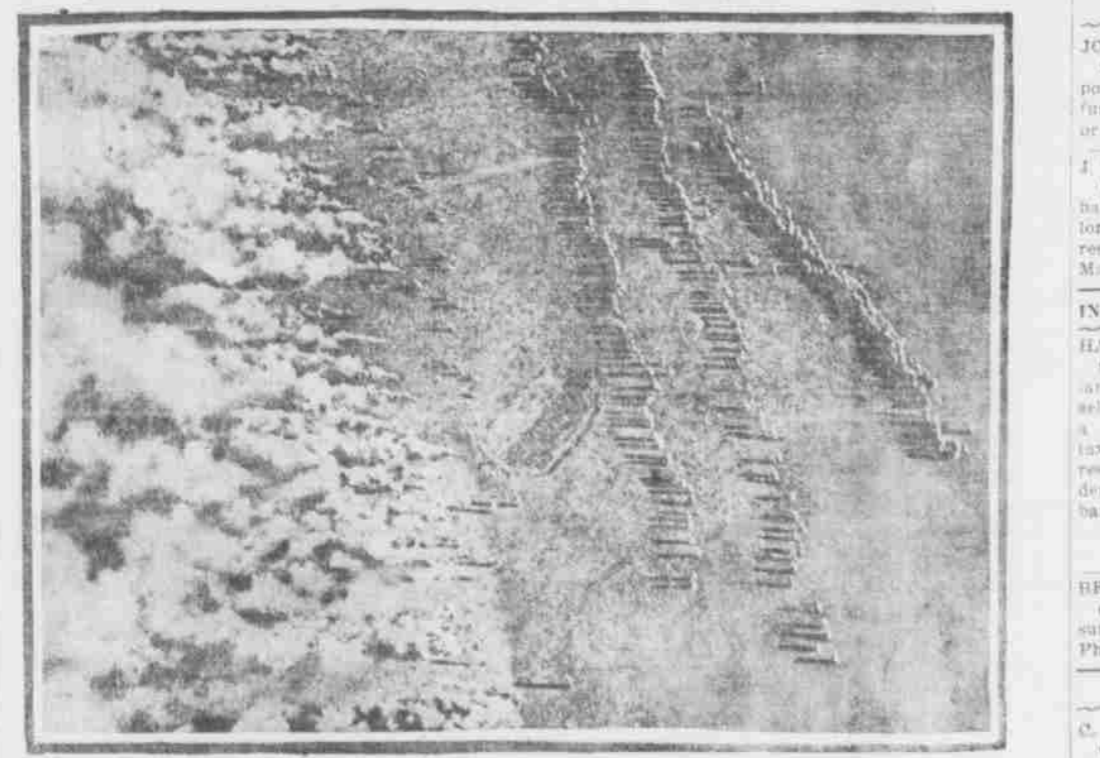
