H.M.S. KING EDWARD STRIKES A MINE AND IS SENT TO BOTTOM

16,000 TON FIGHTER HAS TO BE ABANDONED—NONE OF CREW IS LOST.

LONDON, Jan. 10.—The British battleship King Edward VII has been sunk after striking a mine. The entire crew was saved. This was announced by the admiralty in the following statement:

"H. M. S. King Edward VII has struck a mine. Owing to the heavy sea she had to be abandoned and sank shortly afterward. The ship's company was taken off without any loss of life. Only two men were injured."

The King Edward VII was a battleship of 16,150 tons, laid down in March, 1902. She was 453 feet long, 78 feet beam and 26 feet draught. She had four 12 inch, four 8.2 inch and 16 4-inch guns in her main battery, and was equipped with four torpedo tubes, submerged. Her speed on her trial trip was 23 knots. She had a complement of 777 men.
