Weston Bakery is Destroyed by Fire "Leader" in Danger

(Special Correspondence.)
WESTON, Ore., Jan. 19.—About 6:30 o'clock Sunday morning fire broke out in the Dupuis building on the corner of Main and Water streets. The building was occupied by E. E. Zehm, who has been running a bakery and restaurant. The origin of the fire is unknown. Mr. Zehm and children who were sleeping in the front of the building, did not discover the fire until the rear of the building was in flames. Mr. Zehm was in Spokane at the time. The Weston Leader office and a cottage belonging to Mrs. Margaret Wheeler, now occupied by the Richard Morrison family, were both in very dangerous places, but water was immediately

applied and both escaped with but slight damage. The bakery was completely destroyed. Insurance covered the building and stock.

Boarding House Burns.
ORENCO, Ore., Jan. 19.—The boarding house run by R. M. Scheidel, owned by the Oregon Nursery company, was destroyed by fire. The building was a loss, but most of the contents were saved by the men. The building and contents were partially covered by insurance. The building was one of the landmarks on the Tualatin plains, being on the W. H. Bennett donation land claim. The household goods of Mr. Scheidel were at once moved to a nursery company building and preparations were begun for the evening meal.

Modified Prohibition Wins.
WASHINGTON, Jan. 19.—By a vote of 38 to 24 the senate expressed itself in favor of modified prohibition in the Philippines. An amendment by Senator Gronna of North Dakota was so altered as not to interfere with native drinks.
