GOVERNMENT REPORT MADE ON LIVESTOCK
WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 21.—A summary of estimates of number and values of live stock on farms and ranches on January 1 for Oregon and for the United States, compiled by the Bureau of Crop Estimates (and transmitted through the Weather Bureau), U. S. Department of Agriculture, is as follows:
Horses.
State: Number, 295,000, compared with 294,000 a year ago and 283,000 five years ago. Value per head, \$88, compared with \$90 a year ago and \$111 five years ago.
United States: Number, 21,200,000, compared with 21,195,000 a year ago and 20,217,000 five years ago. Value per head, \$101.50, compared with \$102.35 a year ago and \$114.45 five years ago.
Mules.
State: Number, 10,000, compared with 10,000 a year ago and 10,000 five years ago. Value per head, \$92, compared with \$96 a year ago and \$112 five years ago.
United States: Number, 4,300,000, compared with 4,479,000 a year ago and 4,222,000 five years ago. Value per head, \$112.87, compared with \$112.35 a year ago and \$125.92 five years ago.
Milch Cows.
State: Number, 215,000, compared with 210,000 a year ago and 176,000 five years ago. Value per head, \$55, compared with \$62.50 a year ago and \$42 five years ago.
United States: Number, 22,000,000, compared with 21,342,000 a year ago and 19,523,000 five years ago. Value per head, \$52.90, compared with \$56.33 a year ago and \$29.87 five years ago.
