LONDON, Jan. 3.—(By Mail)—
Australians and New Zealanders are
drifting into London since the abandon-
ment of the British positions on
(Gallipoli) peninsula. In London tea
rooms on street corners and elsewhere
the tanned, burly Australians, the
dusky Maoris and lighter complexioned
New Zealanders meet. They
talk a great deal among themselves
about the abandoned dead. "It was
not leaving the place that hurt, it's
the thought of a fellow's best friends
buried in those gullies and ravines,"
said an Anzac fighter today. He talked
about the appalling number of
