Meeting to arrange for an enlarged committee or executive staff which will include a representative citizen from each town, city and precinct in the county and we are going to take off our coats and work enthusiastically for good roads. We are going to launch a campaign of education and enlighten the people as to the value and costs of the roads under the proposed bond issue and then leave them to decide for themselves.

"Also during my stay in Portland I expect to go over the road situation in Multnomah county and endeavor to find out just what good roads amount to down there and what they cost and every bit of information, both good and bad, that I can get hold of from authentic sources.

"I shall have a great deal to say concerning good roads before this

campaign is over and I am going to know just exactly what I am talking about before I begin. If we are going to have good roads let's have them with a full and complete understanding of what they are going to cost and what returns we may expect from them. Let every voter and taxpayer study the question from every angle and make up his mind fairly and squarely on the merits of the issue."

SAN FRANCISCO, March 9.—Mrs. Gustave Levy, a widow, and her son, Ray, 24 years old, jumped from Land's End into Golden Gate Strait, but were rescued by a woman and a policeman. Ray Levy told the police he and his mother had been without food for two days.

Decision in Bird Law is Delayed

WILL BE SEVERAL MORE MONTHS BEFORE SUPREME COURT SETTLES IT.

That it will be several months yet before the U. S. supreme court decides the constitutionality of the federal migratory bird law but that all federal inspectors must in the meantime insist upon an observance of the law is the substance of a letter received by E. S. Catron, federal inspector at Portland who has sent a copy of the letter to E. F. Averill of this city. The letter, which will interest sportsmen, reads as follows: Mr. E. S. Catron, Federal Inspector, Portland, Oregon.

Dear Sir:—The U. S. supreme court today announced that the Shaver case, involving the constitutionality of the migratory bird law, had been restored to the docket for reargument. This perhaps means several months more of delay in a matter that very much affects your work and greatly interests the gunners in all parts of the country, as well as the friends of wild life.

Our duty, as officers charged with the enforcement of the law, is plain and admits of no equivocation. Until the U. S. supreme court, which alone can decide the matter, hands down a decision settling the constitutionality of the migratory bird law one way or the other, it is our duty to insist on its strict observance, and you are again urged to report for prosecution every case of violation of any of the regulations under the migratory bird law that may come to your notice in which it may be possible to secure sufficient evidence.
