Chinese Editor Dies.

SAN FRANCISCO, March 9.—Ton King Chong, head of the Chinese revolutionary party here, editor of the Chinese republic newspaper and the first senator from here to the new republic, died here.

He was known as Yuan Shi Kals implacable enemy and through his newspaper, and the Young Chinese organization here, fought the president, now the emperor, with unrelenting hatred.

For many months he was protected by body guards in the belief that the emperor was sending men here to as-

assinate him. None of these envoys was ever caught, but Chong's followers took no chances.

News of his death was kept quiet by the Chinese.

SPOKANE, Wash., March 9.—Held responsible for the recent wreck at South Cheney, in which five persons were killed, Conductor J. A. Laviallette and brakeman C. G. Lude, of the Northern Pacific-Burlington train, have been dismissed from the company's service.

FRENCH CENTER IS FORCED BACK

LONDON, March 9.—By a sudden smash on the French center, the Germans captured Fort Devaux and the village of Vaux and adjoining positions for five miles northeast of Verdun, Berlin claimed. This makes two forts in the hands of the Germans attacking Verdun. Fort Devaux, two miles southwest, is now in a dangerous position. Paris failed to confirm the reported German success. Lately the French communiqué has been behind that of the Germans in describing the Verdun operations. The official statements of Paris and Berlin agreed the fighting at Verdun is approaching a crisis. Paris estimated the German casualties are over 125,000.

BERLIN, March 9.—The Germans officially claimed the capture of Fort Devaux, the village of Vaux and adjoining positions.

PARIS, March 9.—The repeated, heavy German attacks against Bethincourt have been repulsed, a communiqué said. Artillery fire lasting for hours preceded the two heaviest assaults. A French curtain of fire from Goose Hill shattered the German attempts. The Germans vainly attempted to dislodge the French in the Corgaux woods but the French consolidated and reconquered the positions there. Intense artillery fighting at other points was reported throughout the night, violent assaults were frequent. Paris claimed these were completely repulsed. Twenty Germans were captured in the La Preve woods. The French continued to bombard the German line of communications in the Argonne.

ADMINISTRATION TO GIVE STATEMENT ON SUBMARINE ISSUES

AMERICAN POSITION WILL BE MADE CLEAR BY SECRETARY OF STATE.

WASHINGTON, March 9.—A statement making clear the American position on the tangled submarine issues will be issued soon, it was learned today. The statement is now being prepared. It is intended to answer the alleged official German propaganda, criticizing America's course. The question, "Is the Kaiser's decree against armed ships a justifiable reprisal against England?" is the most important that America faces now. Upon Lansing's answer to the German memorandum of yesterday, officials believe depends not only our relations with Germany and England but the entire future conduct of submarine warfare.

High School Boys Getting in Shape for Track Season

ATHLETES ARE TURNING OUT AND GOOD MATERIAL IS PROMISED.

The Pendleton high school track season was officially started yesterday evening. Although the weather conditions are not of the best for the athletes to train under, a large number are out every evening to limber up their muscles for the more strenuous work.

Real work will start next Monday, when it is expected that the weather will be good and all will be ready for hard work. Some of the long distance men are now going across country work, while a few of the others are working out in the gym.

In a short time all the men of last year's track team will be out. The basketball team is now resting up for the week before they don the shoes for the cinder track. Only two of last year's men have been lost. These were Carl, the high school's famous half miler, and Osborne in the pole vault. Several new men will be out this season but it is not known yet what they will work out in.

In the 50, 100 and 220 yard dashes will be Siebert, Bowman and La-tourrette. Boyen will probably run the half and quarter. Reed and Minnis are out for the mile. Friedly and Hayden will have the shot. Gordon is out for the javelin, low hurdles, sprints and pole vault. Huey and Myers will work up the high jump.

Mims, once the holder of the north-west javelin record, will again be out for that event. Brown will hurl the discus.

Great work is expected of Siebert and Bowman in the sprints this season, both men showed great class last season.

Gordon, who took last year's pole vault, is again expected to take the event.

All in all, prospects are brighter for a winning team this year than there has been for a long time.

The track at the high school will soon be put in shape for practice in the sprints and weights. Later the men will practice at the Round-up park where they have a better track and where the coming meets will be held.

The first race of the season will be held the last of next week and will be a 4-mile relay in which each class will enter four men, each man to run a mile. The second class meet will be the medley race in which all the races will be run, each class entering a man in each division. Each man touches off the man to run the next race. The race includes the 50 yard, 100 yard, 220 yard dashes, then the quarter, the half and the mile.

Soon after this the inter-class meet will be held. About the last of April or during the first part of May a dual meet will be held on the local track with Walla Walla. Then the boys will go to Baker once more to try for the eastern Oregon championship.

The track coach of the season has not yet been selected but it is quite probable that Chester Gordon, famous track star of the high school and a member of the state champion track team, will be given the position.

PROMOTION AWARDED AMERICAN AT FRONT

VANCOUVER, March 9.—Major Potts, formerly of the United States army serving in the Philippines, is now an officer in the ninety-seventh battalion of the American legion and will, it was authoritatively stated, be promoted to a lieutenant colonelcy and given command of a new American legion to be raised on the Pacific coast and mobilized at Vancouver. It will be known as 2113 overseas battalion, one of the three American battalions newly raised in Canada.
