man captured two salients of about 200 yards. Counter attacks recaptured the territory.

PARIS, March 15.—French troops stormed the German trenches east of the Apremont Forest, and south of Verdun last night, capturing some prisoners. It was officially announced, headquarters stated. There was no change in the remainder of the Verdun front. South of Nieraspach the Germans penetrated French works. Some prisoners and much booty was taken.
