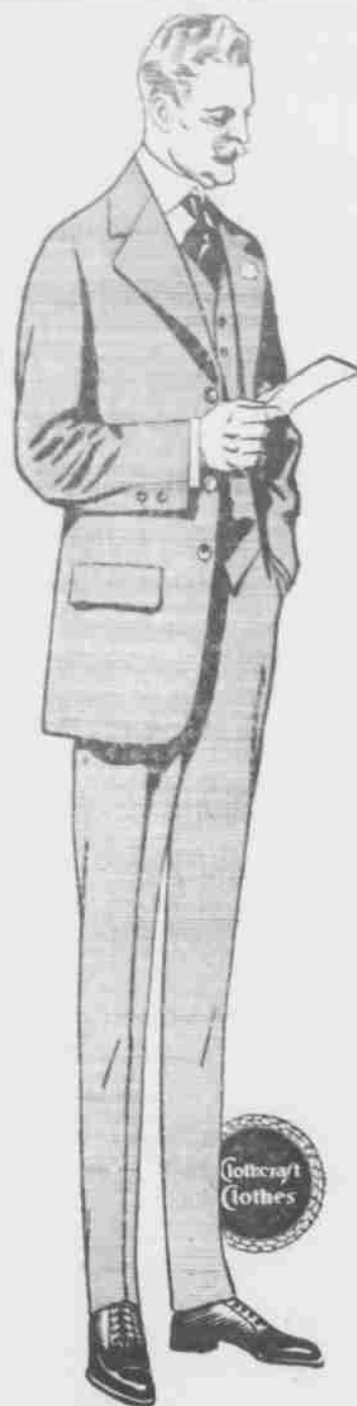

Vienna Stock Market Opens. VIENNA, March 20.—For the first time since the outbreak of the war the stock exchange will open its doors. Transactions will be limited, however, to Austrian investment needs. Dealers in futures and speculative sales will be strictly prohibited. Sales must be for cash, and measures have been adopted for preventing great fluctuations in prices.

For the present the exchange will be open only one hour daily. The reopening was decided on because it was felt that the exchange was the best place for bringing together investors and those persons needing money for industrial and other purposes.

Transactions in stocks of enemy countries will be closely watched, and special steps have been taken to prevent money or securities from going to countries at war with Austria.
