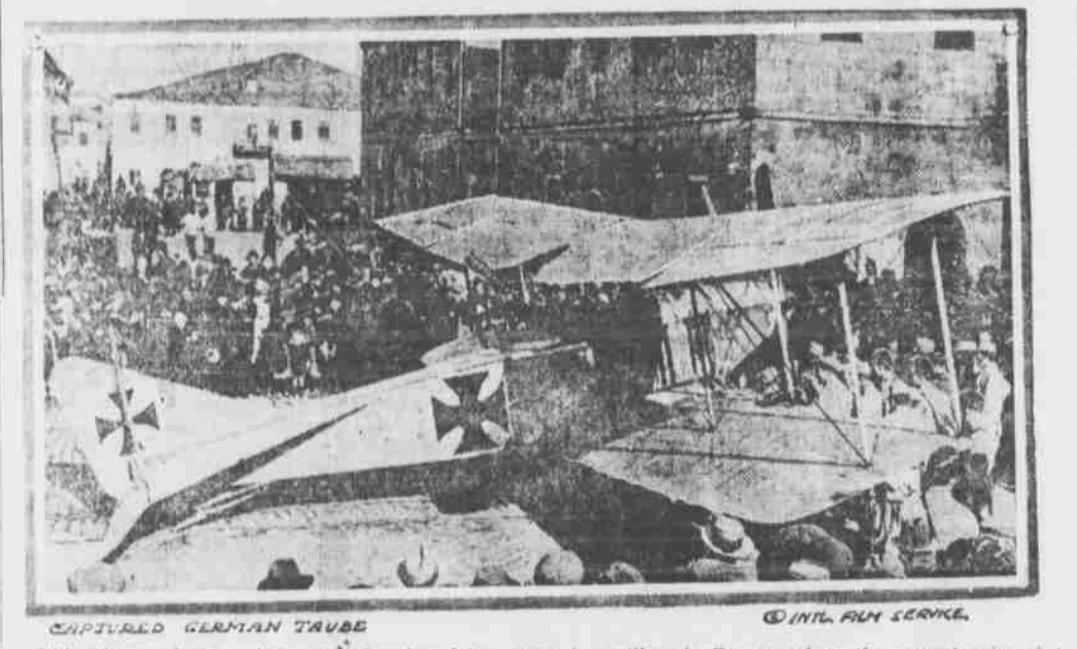

PORTLAND, Oreg.—Cattle market reached a new high level in the North Portland yards during the first day's trading of the week, as forecast in these reports.  
There was a sale of a bunch of ex-

tra good light stuff early in the day at \$8.50 for yearlings, while the general market for tops was around \$8.15 or a nickel above last week's extreme figures.  
There was a small run of cattle in the yard, as expected, and this gave the trade a stronger undertone.

While there were only eight head all told reported in the mutton pens at North Portland over Sunday, the good steers 8.85@7.00 smallest run for many a Monday. The market is now firmly established

at \$10 for top lambs, \$9 for wethers and \$5 for top ewes. These are the highest values ever known in the local market for this time of the season.
