SPEED TYPIST DOES 240 WORDS IN ONE MINUTE AS A TEST

E. G. WISE GIVES EXHIBIT HERE OF HIS SKILL ON THE TYPEWRITER.

Two hundred and forty words a minute, four words to the second! Think of making your fingers fly over the keys of a typewriter at that speed. That is just what was done yesterday afternoon by E. G. Wise, speed artist and efficiency expert for the Remington, as a demonstration in the Hartman Abstract Company's office at 3 o'clock. In making this record Mr. Wise used a memorized sentence.

Copying from a leaflet at his side he succeeded in writing 149 words to the minute, working up to that speed from 100. In another test he wrote for a minute, striking 15 keys to the second. In a number of other ways he demonstrated both his speed and the best methods of saving time and energy in stenographic work.

The abstract offices were filled with stenographers and others interested, and all were amazed at the marvelous speed with which the expert wrote. At that, he says, he is not the champion.
