YOUTH ON WAY TO SCHOOL STEALS RIDE; DEATH COMES INSTANTLY.

FREEWATER, Ore., March 30.—On his way to school from home near Freewater at noon Tuesday, Clarence Collins, aged 9, caught onto a automobile truck unknown to S. G. Pearson, the driver, and Pearson, turning suddenly, threw the boy to the

ground where the wheels of the truck passed over his head and chest. He was instantly killed. Not till Pearson was stopped by the authorities did he learn of the accident. The boy lives about half a mile from Freewater and when he fell to his death was a block from the school.

CENTRALIA, March 30.—It is expected that the present campaign of C. L. Smith, official agriculturalist of the O.-W. R. & N., will result in the number of silos in Lewis county being doubled this year.

Farmer Smith is advocating the production of corn as cow feed and its storage in silos, giving figures showing that \$500,000 will annually be kept in Lewis county that has heretofore been sent to the Yakima valley for feed.
