### SPRING RACE MEET AT CONDON IS SET FOR MAY AND JUNE

THREE DAYS EVENTS WILL BE CONTESTED FOR PURSE OF \$2,000.

Horses from Washington and Oregon are expected to be entered. Meet is financed by businessmen. Work has been going on to put track in first class shape.

CONDON, Ore., March 30.—The dates for Condon's spring race meet have been definitely set for May 31 and June 1 and 2 and \$2000 in purses is offered for that event. The purses are the largest ever offered in this section of the state and horsemen from various parts of Oregon and Washington will be here with good horses. This meet is financed and given an organization of the business men of Condon with J. D. Burns as president and C. W. Harris as secretary. Work on the track has been under way for the past week and it is in fine condition for spring work. There is no better track in eastern Oregon for early spring work than the track at Condon and for this reason many horses are coming here early to train. There will be no harness races here this year and their places will be filled by relay races for a purse of \$500. Purse for the running races range from \$150 to \$300 and the distances are from a quarter mile to three-quarters.

Lincoln Uses Closing Law. NEWPORT, Ore., March 30.—That the Sunday closing law is to be strictly enforced in Lincoln county is evidenced by complaints filed by the prosecuting attorney.

Mrs. M. Anderson of Toledo, who conducts a confectionery and ice cream stand, was arrested last week and was found guilty in a jury trial, fined \$5 and costs. Al Waugh of the same city, also was arrested Saturday before. He pleaded guilty to the charge and was also fined \$5 and costs.

Roumania Ready for War. LONDON, March 30.—The Daily News has received the following from R. Mackenzie, its correspondent at Rome:

War preparations in Roumania are complete. The military authorities will assume control of the railways at the slightest notice. Concentration of the army will rapidly follow the slightest attempt on the part of the Austro-Germans or Bulgarians without a declaration of war.
