Firm Tone for Wheat in Europe

Foreign Nations Have Small Supply on Hand Just Now

PORTLAND, Ore., April 5.—There was a firmer tone abroad for wheat during the day. While much ado has been made recently regarding the great surplus of wheat in Europe, the fact remains that most of the countries are today showing very scant supplies for the rest of the season.

France will need considerable wheat during the next few months and Spain has also reported that its holdings are inadequate to fill requirements.

Even Holland has decided that it will not have a sufficient supply to take care of its needs and further liberal purchases are expected from that quarter. The government has just authorized additional purchases.

At Liverpool the spot wheat market showed strength with prices unchanged to 3d higher than yesterday.

Movement of wheat at Pacific northwest interior points continues restricted. While there are more offers out for supplies, the country is selling but little at prevailing values.

Chicago market was closed for the day, but the session of the Minneapolis trade, which is always a market indication when Chicago is closed, indicated a slight easing in the price.

WHEAT ACREAGE SMALL

Increase in La Grande District Last Year Leads to Reduction.

LA GRANDE, Ore., April 5.—Figures estimated by well-posted farmers indicate that the total wheat acreage of this valley will be below normal this year. Every available foot of land was seeded to wheat to get war prices and now summer fallow must come. Due to the big crop last year, less than the usual amount was seeded, another factor in reducing acreage.

The increase over normal last year was better than one-third and this year probably more than that third will be cut off.

An easing up of the Calcatta burlap market is reported in eastern districts, which say:
