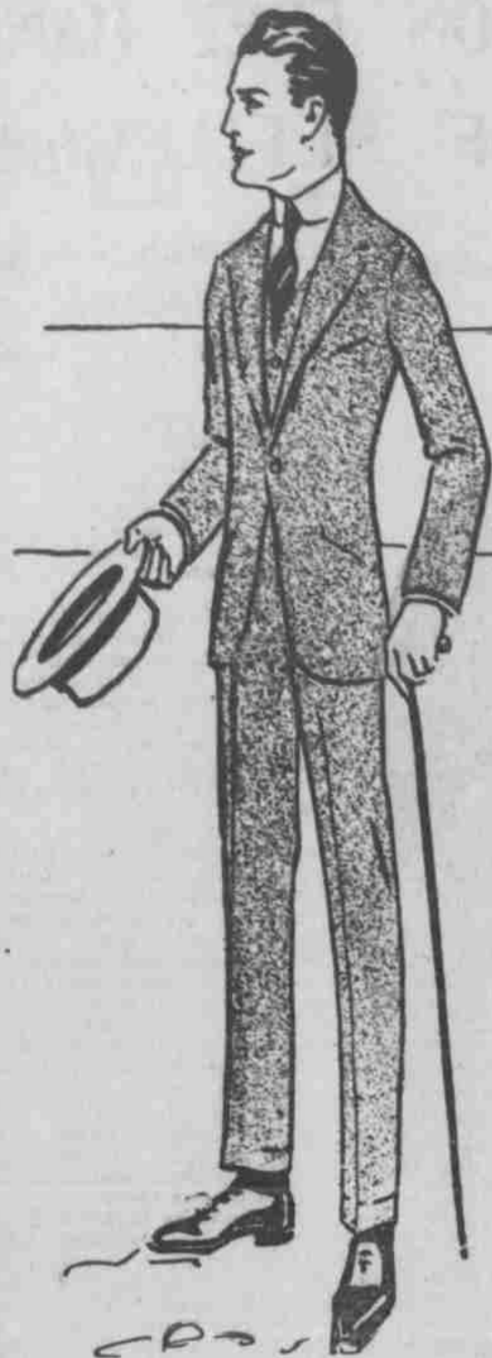

HUGHES' NAME TO GO ON OREGON BALLOT

STATE SUPREME COURT GRANTS PETITION IN VERBAL OPINION YESTERDAY.

SALEM, Ore., April 20.—The name of Charles E. Hughes will be printed on the Oregon republican primary ballot as a candidate for the nomination for president of the United States, despite his expressed request that it be omitted.

Supreme Court Decides.
This was the decision of the Oregon supreme court, when it handed down a verbal opinion from the bench ordering Secretary of State Olcott to place Justice Hughes' name on the ballot, as prayed for in the application of Wallace McCamant, of Port-

land, for issuance of writ of mandamus against the secretary. The court will hand down a written opinion in the case some time this week. The decision of the court was unanimous. Justice Eakin and Justice Moore did not sit.

Reasons Come Later.
The court, in announcing its decision, did not give reasons, and these will be contained in the opinion to be handed down later. The mandamus proceedings were

instituted after Secretary Olcott had refused to place Justice Hughes' name on the ballot. The secretary acted in accordance with the request of Justice Hughes, who notified him that he was not a candidate for the nomination for president and asked that his name be omitted.

The court's decision sets a precedent, it is declared, and enunciated rights of the people to place the name of any person on the ballot for whom they wish to express their choice for nomination to an office.
