forks of a big white elm tree on the farm of Arthur Lee, near this town.

How the gooseberry bush became grafted on the elm nobody knows. It was discovered by Mr. Lee's father when he homesteaded on the farm. At first it was not given much attention, but of late years it has been carefully guarded. Each year the bush sends out leaves and blossoms, but never, so far as known has borne any fruit.

It is supposed that a seed of the wild gooseberry fell into a cavity of the tree and took root, the roots finally grafting themselves on the tree. There is no sign of a cavity now, however, the bush appearing at first to be simply a branch of the tree. It is 20 feet above the ground.

WOOLEN CLOTHES TO BE CURIOSITY SOON

MANUFACTURERS NOT ABLE TO SECURE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE TRADE.

PORTLAND, Ore., May 3.—A leading Portland clothing man made the statement that so great has been the demand for cloth and clothing and so scarce have been supplies of wool that it would be next to impossible for anyone to purchase real woolen suits during the coming fall and winter months.

Woolen underclothes, according to the trade, will practically be a thing of the past so far as the next season is concerned.

Even shoddy is so scarce that such clothing will almost be considered a luxury after present stocks of woollens are exhausted.

Such statements indicate the real basis for the present great strength of the wool market. World's stocks of wool, which have been inadequate to fill requirements during recent years, will this season fall still shorter of requirements. For the last two seasons American woolen mill interests have purchased liberally of English colony fleeces in order to meet a portion of their requirements, while some business of moment was done in South America. With the English colony wools prohibited from going elsewhere but to an English possession or an ally, the American mills will be compelled to take whatever is offered in South America and in this country. In South America they will meet with strong competition from the English and French interests and extreme prices are therefore expected.

In the meantime there is little business shown at Pacific northwest points, because growers are not inclined to offer. While further fractional advances are offering in value sheepmen are holding off.

HINKLE'S SPEECH.

the point I want you to get. This macadam road must be hard surfaced in order to save the \$6000 a mile already invested in it. The people of the east end of the county through which this road runs realize this. They know that eventually they will get a hard surfaced road over this macadam. If you do not vote this bond issue the county will have to take the regular tax money and hard surface this road. Then the people up there will have their hard surfaced road and when do you think they will be willing to vote either tax or bonds to build you a road? They never will and you know they won't.

Why are they down here today opposing this bond issue under which you get a good road? Because they know they are sure to get their good road if you will help them without voting the bonds. They want you to defeat the bonds, give up your own prospects for a good road and let them receive the benefit from the road tax for the next five or six years in the hard surfacing of their macadam road.

Since the macadam road was first put under construction how much road tax money has the country around Pilot Rock received? Where has all the road tax money gone? Where is it going now? Where will it continue to go if this road is hard surfaced without a bond issue? You can readily see where it will go and you can see how long you will have to wait to get your good roads and you can easily figure out what your prospects are.

The millage tax plan is but another scheme for hard surfacing the macadam road. This tax cannot be voted for five years. It can be voted for only one year at a time. Supposing this fall you should vote this additional two mill tax raising a hundred thousand dollars, where would the money be spent? Hard surfacing the macadam road, of course. And then, next year, if you voted the same two mill tax again, where would the money be spent? Hard surfacing the macadam road. When that road was finally hard surfaced its entire length do you think there would be any further additional two mill tax voted? You know there would not.

Who is the father of this scheme, who is heading this opposition to the bond issue? C. A. Barrett of Athens, millionaire wheat farmer. W. W. Harrah, another millionaire wheat farmer. John Vert of Pendleton, a millionaire land owner. There are several others whose names appear on the advertisements but they are merely figureheads. These men are the bull wethers.

Where is the road in which they would be interested? The macadam road. Did these men come out and oppose the construction of the macadam road? Did they try to stop it? Are they going to oppose the hard surfacing of this no-good macadam? No, they are perfectly willing that the county authorities shall go ahead taking your road tax money, Echo's, Hermiston's, Stantfield's and Umatilla's road tax money, Helix's road tax money and continue building and improving their road. But they are not willing that you people up here or any other section of the county shall have a decent road; or that even you shall have value received for money you pay in road taxes. They want all the benefit and if they cannot receive all the benefit they are opposed to it.

What are you going to do about it? Are you going to sit idly while they continue taking your road tax money and giving you nothing in return? It is true their section of the coun-

ty pays considerable taxes but no more in proportion than you do. There is the richest section in the county, in the state or on the face of the earth. Compared with the productive value of the land they do not pay as much road tax as the south end of the county. But where they have farms of several thousand acres and no school house and no families living upon the land you have the small farm and a dozen families where they have one; you have the school house where they have only the warehouse for storing their grain; you have the community life where they have nothing but rich, productive wastes. There is a manless and childless land and all its golden wealth is nothing compared with the community where there is the school house and school children, and the home and fireside and the rural life that makes and is the wealth both material and spiritual of our country.


