**NOTICE OF REQUEST FOR BIDS FOR STREET SPRINKLING.**  
Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received at the office of the City Recorder, in Pendleton, Oregon, up to 3 o'clock P. M., on May 14, 1916, for sprinkling the unpaved streets of the City of Pendleton for the season of 1916.  
For the purpose of sprinkling, the City will be divided into districts as follows:  
District No. 1—All that part of the City lying north of the Umatilla River.  
District No. 2—All that part of the City lying south of the Umatilla River and east of Main Street.  
District No. 3—All that part of the City lying south of the Umatilla River and west of Main Street.  
No street that has been paved to be included in the contract. Each bid must specify the price per man and team per month, straight time, man and team to be under the direction of the Street Commissioner when not engaged in street sprinkling; the City to furnish sprinkling wagons and water. Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check in the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00), made payable to the order of the Mayor of the City of Pendleton, as an evidence of good faith, the same to be forfeited to the City if the bidder is successful and refuses to sign the contract with the City in accordance with the terms of this notice, and to be returned to the bidder if unsuccessful. The Common Council reserves the right to reject any and all bids, in its discretion.

## Cattle Famine Threatened in Country

### Situation Acute in United States

PORTLAND, Ore., May 10.—Latest reports received from leading cattle producing centers of the country indicate a serious condition so far as supplies are concerned. With heavy exportations of beef to Europe and with a fast decreasing supply of cattle in this country, the outlook is seemingly for a famine in meats such as this country has never witnessed.

This has called forth comment from consuming and butchering interests to the effect that the government should place an embargo against further foreign shipments until the American supplies become heavier.

Such agitation is likely to become stronger as the price of beef on the hoof advances and the price to the consumer moves higher. The recent advance in the price of baby beef at North Portland to the highest price on record here for open market transactions indicates quite clearly that there is a dearth of real good quality, and that killers are vying with one another to secure these supplies. This means not only extreme prices for top quality stuff, but also means that all beef prices will be advanced in proportion.

In the Pacific northwest the decrease in cattle holdings has been less marked than in other sections of the country, but the withdrawal of supplies for eastern shipment has made the shortage here even more acute than elsewhere.

### LIVERPOOL HIGHER EVEN WITH STOCKS ON A HEAVY SCALE

PORTLAND, Ore., May 10.—While very heavy receipts of wheat are shown at Liverpool and purchases to go forward are also heavy for the immediate future, there was a slightly better feeling in the cash wheat trade there during the day. Broomhall quoted cash wheat unchanged to 2d higher for the day.

Chicago market showed little change during the early trading, the market not making the serious decline expected as a result of Monday's government report showing less crop damage than expected. The trade is much inclined to take this report with a grain of salt, especially as it gives Oregon a very poor crop outlook, when it has one of the best in the country, while it gives the middle west a better showing when all connected with the trade have direct information which would indicate a poor showing.

The market for wheat here continues to mark time. Millers are seeking supplies here and there at printed
