"The Stain in the Blood" With Edythe Sterling and Norbert Myles.

Vicious traits inherited by a youth, which environment and careful upbringing fail to remedy, for the foundation for "The Stain in the Blood," Robert A. Dillon's unusually powerful drama in which Edythe Sterling and Norbert Myles, as sister and brother, appear to splendid advantage. Pointing out a logical way in which criminal tendencies, insanity and disease, can be passed from one generation to another, this gripping drama combines a novel treatment of a live subject of discussion with an absorbing heart interest story.

Mary and Joe Thompson are made orphans by an Indian raid on the wagon train which is carrying their family westward. Joe early develops vicious traits which finally lead him to highway robbery and Mary is forced to flee with him to the east. Her loyalty and devotion, however, fail to keep him out of the hands of the law and while he is serving a long term in prison she becomes the wife of an inventor who is kept in ignorance of her family skeleton. Another woman enters her husband's life and Mary pleads with him to reform. He learns of her flight from the west and obtains a hotel register in which her name is written with that of her brother given a rare opportunity to show their wonderful talents for strong emotional acting in a series of thrilling scenes which bring the unusual drama to a powerful close.

Samson and Delilah—Cosy Today. The story of Samson is the story of the strongest man that ever lived. His name today is known to almost every man, woman and child throughout the civilized world, and even those that do not know his story, his name is synonymous of strength. But besides that, the thrilling story of the life of that man, to whom God gave power and strength such as no man possessed, and to whom he gave carte blanche in righting his wrongs, is the most spectacular, romantic and tragic of any of the heroes of antiquity.

The film representation which the Universal has evolved from the history of Samson and told in six wonderful reels follows the account in the books of Judges with startling accuracy. Nothing is left out. The film shows the anxiety of Samson's parents for a son, the prophecy of his birth and tremendous strength as long as he remains unshaven. Then the camera skips to the time of his young manhood, his courtship of the daughter of the Philistines, and his betrothal. On the way to the marriage he slays a lion, and upon returning to the carcass some time later, he notices that the bees have begun to live in it. From this circumstance he propounds a riddle which the Philistines are unable to answer until they force Samson to find out for them. Samson has promised thirty changes of raiment for the solution of the riddle and he is very angry. He casts off his wife, sets fire to the fields of the Philistines and killing thirty men of Askelon he disdainfully pays his wager to the Philistines. Then he retreats to a cave, whence he is sought out by an army of the Philistines who have determined to kill him at any cost. But Samson slays a thousand of them with the jawbone of an ass and puts the rest to flight. Later they try to imprison him in the city of Gaza, but he carries off the gates of the city. Now Samson meets Delilah, who at the instigation of Sihon, the ruler of the Philistines, entices from him the secret of his great strength, shears his head and delivers him to the soldiers, who put out his eyes and after almost beating him to death put him to work in the grinding mill.

Sometime later the Philistines, giving a feast in the temple of Dagon, sent for the blind Samson to make sport for them while they feasted. He comes, led by a small boy. In desperation at the humiliation put upon him he asks the boy to lead him to the pillars which support the temple. Praying to the Lord to give him back his strength this once he leans upon the pillars and the roof of the great temple of Dagon comes tumbling down upon the multitudes.

"And those that he killed at his death where more than all they that which he slew during his lifetime." This wonderful feature will be shown at the Cosy theater Tuesday for one day only.
