NOTED DANCER IS NOW MEMBER WILLIAM FOX CAST

Hattie Burks, Vaudeville and Musical Comedy star acts in "Sins of Men."

Hattie Burks, known throughout America as a member of the vaudeville team of Lorraine and Burks, and as a musical comedy dancer, appears in her first picture under William Fox presentation in the recently released film, "Sins of Men," starring Stuart Holmes and Dorothy Bernard. Miss Burks may be especially favorably remembered as the featured dancer in the Viennese opera, "The Blue Paradise," in which company she played for nearly a year just prior to her entering the moving picture field with Mr. Fox.

Women who carry their fashions to the ultimate limit of blarneyness will be quick to remember Hattie Burks as the female of the species who first brought "minaret" gowns to America. While playing a series of engagements in the English halls Miss Burks conceived the idea of the "minaret" and straightway went to Paris and had it built just the way she wanted it.

Rated by most men as an atrocity of costume it served the purpose for which a feminine mind conceived it— attracted attention. Once having accomplished that nothing was able to stop it and women who were bulky around the middle became even more so with the accentuated narrow and semi-pantalon skirts tapering downward, while the waste line and hip dimension bulged outward noticeably.

In vaudeville Miss Burks has worn most astonishing gowns— always of her own creation and design— and these she hopes to bring into the movies soon.

This new Fox player is a Louisville girl still in her teens who has not been spoiled by success. She has played both in England and France with great success, being in Paris, by the way, in September, 1914, when the war broke out, then in London and back home in a hurry to work in a Ned Wayburn production. She has attracted widespread attention in "The Blue Paradise," and is excellently fitted to become a popular ingenue in pictures. She has never appeared in a picture before. Pastime today.

At the Alta.

A man's losing fight against the craving for drink, his fall to the depths, his rise through the spirit of revenge, and ultimate triumph through love, form the basis of "The Unpardonable Sin," the new World Film feature in which Holbrook Blinn, the noted dramatic screen star, will be seen at the Alta on Thursday only.

No actor of the present day excels Mr. Blinn in the delineation of vivid and powerful types, and in this picture he is exceptionally fortunate in having a role that impels him to run the gamut of emotional expression as well as picture widely contracting strains of character. He appears first as a wealthy, carefree young man and depicts with graphic power the gradual moral and physical decay resultant from his over-indulgence in drink. Again the power of his personality fairly vibrates the screen as he portrays his regeneration, his triumph over his enemy, and his great moment of sacrifice.

Mr. Blinn has been surrounded by a remarkable cast that includes such favorites of the film world as Helen Fulton, Lila Haywood Chester, Walter D. Greene, William A. Morton and Charles D. Mackay. The picture was directed by Barry O'Neill.

Peter B. Kyne's humanly inspiring story, "The Three Godfathers," originally printed in the Saturday Evening Post, has been translated into Bluebird Photoplays and will be the attraction at the Cosy theater today with a splendid company of camera-actors depicting its gripping scenes. Harry Carey, George Berrell and Frank Lanning will impersonate the three men who found themselves, and their babe in their keeping. The fact that they were in the middle of the Mojave desert, almost overwhelmed by the effect of a sand-storm, made all the more difficult their task of untutored and unaided paternalism. When the narrative was originally published Editor Horace Lorrimer said it was the best story ever printed in the Post. With such human interest as its basis one may readily believe that "The Three Godfathers" will result in a proportionately good photoplay.
