### AUTHORITY ON CITY IMPROVEMENT WILL BE AT CHAUTAUQUA

CHARLES ZUEBLIN OF BOSTON WILL LECTURE HERE ON CIVIC PROBLEMS.

Never before have people paid so much attention to the problem of city building and development as they are at present. Such problems as the caring for smoke from the great factories and the cleaning of streets, the beautifying of parkings and public places and the development of municipal water and light systems are before the public in a greater degree than ever before.

There is a new awakening—the realization that if people are to be happy, they must live under right living conditions.

Coming to Chautauqua is a man who has made a life study of the smaller cities and their problems. He probably knows more about how to develop the smaller cities and how to solve its many municipal problems than any other man in the country today. That man is Charles Zueblin of Boston, a speaker in constant demand and one who is noted for his practical ideas on civic matters.

Contrary to what one would expect, Mr. Zueblin does not talk in that deep, scientific method used by some lecturers on such subjects. He talks straight from the shoulder in a clear cut manner and tells in a practical way of the reforms that can be adopted by any set of people in any community. Bringing Mr. Zueblin to Chautauqua is but another one of the big things that the chautauqua does for the community in real service.

Belgians Kept Indoors.

AMSTERDAM, via London, June 20.—The German military governor of Roulers, Belgium, has ordered the population to remain indoors from 2 o'clock in the afternoon until 8 o'clock in the morning for three weeks, says the Telegraf.

This action was taken, the newspaper adds, because the citizens gave food without authority to Russian prisoners employed in agricultural work.

### MILAN REPORT LAYS BLAME FOR MEXICAN CRISIS ON GERMANS

MILAN, June 23.—Further news confirms the report that Admiral Von Koster repeatedly has declared within the last few days that the German submarine war on merchant vessels is about to be resumed with greater violence than ever and that this is connected with affairs in Mexico, where Germany has found a new ally.

The object is to place the United States government in such a position that not only will it not have time to busy itself about the European war, especially the German submarine exploits, but will prevent all exportation of arms and ammunition to Europe as if the United States is at war with Mexico it will need all the arms and ammunition it can manufacture at home. This is a long matured scheme of Berlin, which the Germans are confident is bringing a favorable issue.
