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PORTLAND TO KEEP OPEN HOUSE DURING PYTHIAN GATHERING

PRESS CLUB PLANS TO ENTERTAIN DELEGATES AT THE CONVENTION.

Big Time is set for August 1 to 10 and Knights From Every Point are Expected to Attend; Many May Visit Round-Up; Many Interesting Events on the Program.

An indication of the character of hospitality that is to be on tap in Oregon during the time of the conventions of the Supreme Lodge and the Supreme Temple the Portland Press club has sent out word that it will keep open house for all visiting Knights of Pythias and Pythian Sisters between August 1 and 10. Its writing rooms, its library and the conveniences of a large assembly room are to be at the command of individual members, or committees.

The Press Club never closes its rooms at Portland. Its members are mostly newspaper men, a portion of whom work at night, and it is a rule that their club home shall be open at all times to receive the weary news gatherer.

As a social organization it occupies an unique place in the city. Its "high jinks" are always attended by hundreds of the most prominent men of the state of Oregon. Just recently the club had the 136 candidates for county offices at Portland on the carpet and grilled them without mercy.

When the Supreme Representatives arrive in Portland it is probable that the Press Club will have something arranged by which the common, ordinary, subordinate lodge man can see the starch taken out of their dignity.

The Portland committee is insisting that 25,000 members of the order gather at Portland during the convention, and that they linger long enough in the state to attend the Pendleton Round-Up, the greatest West Show given anywhere in the world. It occurs in September. The interval can be well filled by trips to various interesting sections of the Northwest.

The parade committee is positive that they will pull off an unusually interesting stunt when the parade starts down the street. The program committee is constantly adding new features to the list of daily events, so that every person in attendance will have something to look forward to, even though they are not members of the Supreme Lodge. In this respect Portland hopes to exceed any other city where these bodies have met.

A section of the big sea food dinner at Seaside will be devoted to mussels. They grow nowhere else as they do at Seaside and are a distinct delicacy. In fact the Knights at Astoria are herding and feeding oysters, clams, mussels and salmon to get them into prime condition for the big frolic on the beach.

ORDER IN COUNCIL IS EXPECTED TO PLEASE

LONDON, July 11.—It is believed here that neutral powers, including the United States, will welcome the new order in council signed by King George withdrawing previous orders in council and establishing definitely laws to be imposed on ships carrying contraband through the war zone.

It was pointed out here that the United States early in the war elected to disregard the declaration of London, under which previous orders in council were issued and which has been abandoned by both England and France. The regulations published some of the causes of dispute between the allies and neutral powers because the terms are clearly stated.

DRUGS ARE STOLEN; STORE IS DYNAMITED

ROSLYN, Wash., July 11.—To cover up the theft of cocaine and morphine, burglars dynamited the drugstore at Thomas Stoves of Cle Elum, some time early Saturday morning, according to the statements of officers. The front of the store and a large portion of the interior was wrecked. The damage amounted to approximately \$750.

That the job was done by some frenzied drug user is the opinion of Chief of Police Arthur Byars, of Cle Elum. It was found that the cash in the register and safe were not disturbed, nor was a valuable watch nor any other article missing save two eight-ounce bottles of cocaine and one eight-ounce bottle of morphine.

Access to the building was had through a rear window by breaking it with a lead pipe. The dynamite was placed under the prescription case, which was ruined. The explosion awakened the city, and two men were said to have been seen escape on horseback to the east. Deputy Sheriff W. C. Minton took the trail, with bloodhounds, but the dogs lost the scent where the men deserted the horses.

Cle Elum during the past year has had a number of fires, all starting about the same time of night as this explosion, and many of the citizens express the belief that the city is the victim of some fanatic.

Finger prints found in the dust of the window sill have been copied, and may lead to the identification of the burglars.

MEXICAN STEERS TO BE BROUGHT ACROSS LINE AS FORMALLY

ROUND-UP DOES NOT ANTICIPATE TROUBLE IN GETTING THE LONG-HORNS.

Border Expected to Be Open for Entry the Same as Heretofore Despite the Presence of American Troops; Directors, However, Plan for Any Emergency.

Though Uncle Sam is rushing troops to the border to prevent any more Mexicans from coming into the country, the Round-Up anticipates that the border line will not be closed to the entry of long-horned Mexican steers and Livestock Director Sam B. Thompson has already begun negotiations looking to securing a herd of these fleet-footed, wrinkled-eyed, attitudinized, sharp-hoofed brutes.

Fearful lest strained relations between Mexico and the United States may result in war and thus make it difficult to purchase Mexican cattle, the directors are taking early steps to get a sufficient number to put on the roping, bulldogging and maverick contests at the 1916 Round-Up. Before long the Round-Up expects to make a definite announcement that a carload of the steers are on their way north.

CITY WILL COMPLY WITH PLAN TO HELP TROOPERS' FAMILIES

MATTER IS BROUGHT UP BEFORE COMMERCIAL CLUB LAST EVENING.

President Brock Refers Question to Committee on Public Policy; Families of Soldiers Will Be Assured White Heads of Households Are on the Border.

The matter of Pendleton cooperating with the Oregon Patriotic League in providing relief for the families of wage-earners who have gone to the Mexican border with the militia was last evening referred by President Brock of the Commercial association to the committee on public policy of which W. J. Clarke is chairman. The committee was instructed to take steps toward complying with the urgent request of the governor for immediate action.

President Brock last evening also brought up the matter of a continuance of the institution of Happy Canyon. Only a brief discussion was indulged in but such remarks as were made were favorable to the putting on of another evening show during Round-Up.

R. E. Chloupek, instructor in manual training at the high school, was last evening elected to membership in the club. The biggest part of the evening was spent in discussing the normal school situation, an account of which appears elsewhere in this paper.

OREGON WILL FIGHT INFANTILE PARALYSIS

PORTLAND, Ore., July 10.—Oregon medical authorities will take due precautions against the spreading of infantile paralysis in this state, according to Dr. Andrew C. Smith, State Health Officer. Dr. David N. Roberg left for Seattle to consider joint action between the Oregon and Washington authorities.

"Oregon will take no chances with the dread disease," said Dr. Smith. "Cognizant of the fearful effects that might be visited upon this state should the strange malady become prevalent here, the state board of health will hold a meeting July 14 to consider every phase of the situation."

SECURITIES HELD IN GERMANY MAY BE SOLD IN THE UNITED STATES

NEW YORK, July 12.—The financial possibilities of a Transatlantic U-boat service, according to Wall Street's leading bankers, include: First—The sale here of all German-owned securities still held in Germany.

Second—Gold shipments to the United States.

Third—The export from Germany of valuable and greatly needed commodities, especially dyestuffs.

Fourth—Facilitated transfer of funds thus eliminating dependence on neutral countries.

Fifth—Likelihood of improvement in the value of the German mark and the Austrian crown here.

The International News Service informants, who include the country's best known bankers, were one in declaring that the arrival of the U-boat Deutschland will have no marked financial influence.

They stated that the stock market

would not be unduly depressed owing to the possibility of an influx of American securities owned in Germany.

Great interest attached to the amount of American securities still held by Germans. Estimates vary from \$100,000,000 to \$500,000,000.

The stocks still principally held include Baltimore & Ohio common and preferred, Union Pacific, Great Northern, Canadian Pacific and United States steel. Large blocks of American mining stocks are also believed to be seeking our market.

U. S. DIVERS COULD EQUAL U-BOAT CRUISE

WASHINGTON, July 12.—United States submarines can duplicate the Deutschland's trans-Atlantic feat if the occasion arises, navy experts said.

A flotilla of K class submarines last summer cruised 2000 miles from Honolulu to San Francisco. They could have cruised for a week longer under the same conditions and at the same speed maintained by the German super-submarine.

It is only under the terrific strain of high speed cruises that American submarines have developed engine troubles, the naval officers declared.
