GRAIN AND HOG MARKETS SLOW

PORTLAND, Oct. 14.—Much strength was shown in foreign markets for wheat and this created a firmer feeling in the local trade and country bids were generally showing a slight advance.

There is again much disposition on the part of eastern interests to secure supplies of wheat in the Pacific northwest, but late business has been of limited nature, owing to the lack of incentive among producers to hurry sales.

Perhaps the strongest feature of the grain market situation at the moment is the hay market. Shortage is shown in practically every line. Clover, which usually shows a dull and stagnant tone most of the year, is now in liberal demand, but little stuff is being offered.

Millstuffs are quoted steady by millers with California still in the market for supplies. Liverpool market on Thursday was steady with spot wheat unchanged to 1d higher. Cargo market 3/4 1-2d higher.

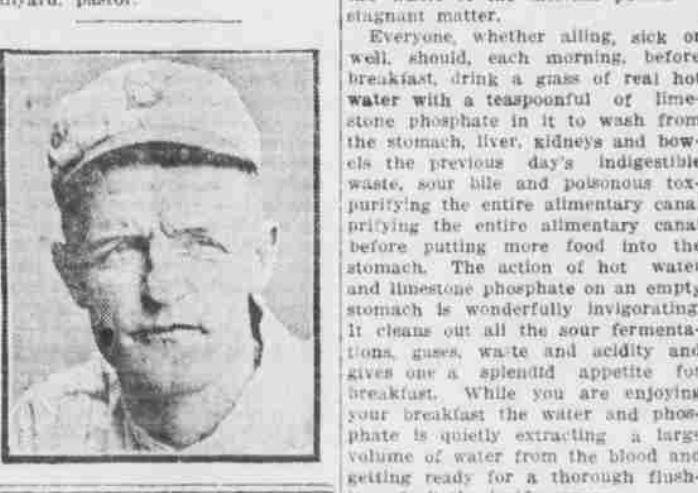
