INDIANAPOLIS, Oct. 21.—Farmers of the national congress considered resolutions demanding an administration farm loan board law for the benefit of the nation's farmers. They hit at the alleged misuse of the law by writers and denounced the repeal of the waterpower bills in the senate. They declared in favor of woman suffrage and protested against increased freight rates.

**BOY TEASES BULL; ANIMAL KILLS HIM**

Lance Against Body Crushes Ribs of Glen Mills Reform School Inmate.

MEHA, Pa., Oct. 21.—Russell Nichols of Goodville, Pa., was killed by a bull at the Glen Mills reform school yesterday. The animal crushed the boy against the side of a stall in a stable. The boy went to the building with other boys to do the stable work. There were no guards about, and he teased the bull, which was tied in a stall. The animal, which had been dehorned, resented the teasing and threw him into a corner of the stall. He then lunged against the boy's body with his head, crushing his ribs. The victim died from internal hemorrhage. Nichols was 15 years old.

**WATCH FOR BANDS ON WILD DUCKS.**

If you kill or capture a wild duck bearing an aluminum band around one leg, having a number on one side and on the other a statement requesting that the United States department of agriculture, or the biological survey, department of agriculture, Washington, D. C. This band, if accompanied by a statement as to date, place and circumstances under which the bird was taken will be of service to the survey in its efforts to determine the longevity of individual ducks and the routes of migration of the species. The bands are being attached to considerable numbers of wild duck of several species which have been cured of the duck sickness prevalent around Great Salt Lake, Utah, and there released. The department is particularly anxious to secure reports from these birds to determine their complete recovery from this malady which has killed hundreds of thousands of ducks in Utah.

**HUGHES RESTS FROM HIS STRENUOUS CAMPAIGN TOUR**

NEW YORK, Oct. 21.—Candidate Hughes went immediately to the Astor hotel on his arrival and conferred with Chairman Willcox. He rests until Wednesday and plans to speak in Brooklyn Wednesday night. He will invade Indiana and Ohio again. He avoids rear platform speeches, addressing only mass meetings. Hughes is very tired but expressed great confidence and complete satisfaction with the results of his extended tour.

**BRIEF ITEMS.**

Prairie dogs can be destroyed by poison at a cost varying, according to prevailing conditions, from 5 to 5 cents an acre.  
 Under the federal road act within the next five years \$160,000,000 will be spent by federal and state governments in improving rural roads. Eight million, 422 hundred and eighty thousand dollars of federal and state Smith-Lever funds will be spent each year after 1922 on the direct education of farmers.  
 Every spring the lights of the light-houses along the coast lure to destruction myriads of birds en route from their winter homes in the south to their summer nesting places in the north.  
 Sixty-seven state agricultural colleges and experiment stations are devoted to the development of agriculture. Their endowment, plant and equipment amount to \$160,000,000. They have an income of more than \$25,000,000, with 5500 teachers and a resident student body of over 75,000.

CHRISTIANIA, Oct. 21.—A royal letter was issued today forbidding from Oct. 20 submarines belonging to belligerent navies traveling in Norwegian territorial waters, under penalty of attack without warning.
