

KEEL OF SUPER DREADNAUGHY CALIFORNIA IS LAID AT NOON TODAY.

Phousands of Wildly Cheering Chibfornia Citizens View Geremonies State and City Officials, Togeth With Army and Navy Officials Participate.

MARE ISLAND NAVY YARD, Cal. Oct. 25.—In the presence of thou-sands of wildly cheering Californians. the keel of the super-dreadnaught California, the largest warship ever put under construction on the Pacific nst, was la'd here at noon today. United States Senator James D. Phelan and officials of the navy yard represented the government, while Congresman Curry, Mayor James Roney of Vallejo and state and municipal officials formed the reveting gang that hammered the first rivets into place and began actual work of construc-

The ceremonies took place at noon, after the battleship Oregon, famous "bulldog of the navy," and itself a product of a San Francisco bay shipyard, brought the party of state and ity officials, representatives of bay region cities, army and navy officers and scores of other prominent peo-

Owing to the fact that the new ship named after the Golden State and s being built in California, the carenonics were largely attended by the Golden West. The state officers were members of the party abound the Oregon and the members of nearby par-lors were in attendance. The California Pioneers' Society was also well represented.

It is the intention to launch the California in January, 1918. She will be christened and ready for a trial rip a year later.

The California's specifications are the latest ideas in naval construction, largely the result of careful study of naval engagements in the European war. The big ship has many features not to be found on ships now in servic. The armoring of the vesse is planned to guard also against tor-pedo attacks and mines. Navai con-structors believe that the ship will be impregnable against such attacks

The super-dreadnaught will be \$24 feet long, 96 feet in width and 47 feet 2 inhes deep. At her mean draft of 30 feet 3 incres, she will have a displacement of 32,200 tons and will be capable of sustaining a speed of 21 knots an hour for twelve continuous hours.

The California's principal battery will be twelve 14-inch fifty-saliber breech-loading rifles. These guns are to be of an exceptionally powerful new type. They will be mounted in threes, in four center line turrets. which will be heavily armored. The remainder of the armament includes twenty-two five-inch rapid-fire guna four submerged torpedo tubes, six-pounders (mainly for saluting). four 3-inch anti-aircraft guns, two one pounder guns for ship's boats, a 3-inch landing piece and several 39callber machine guns,

The California's machinery operated by electricity. This will be furnished by mammoth generators. driven by oil-burning turbines. When fully manned the California will have a complement of 58 officers and 1022
