## TOBACCO SUPPLY IS LESS THAN IN 1915

WASHINGTON, Nov. 6.—Domestic tobacco held in the United States by large manufacturers on October 1 amounted to 276,275,297 pounds, compared with 335,367,657 last year; imported tobacco 35,290,911 pounds, against 63,653,729 last year, according to the census bureau today. The term "large manufacturers" means who produced last year 50,000 pounds of tobacco or 250,000 cigars or 1,600,000 cigarettes.
