MENACE FRENCH STEEL SUPPLY

PARIS, France, Oct. 10.—Senator Henry Bergeron commenting on Germany's intensification of submarine warfare, separates the problem into two parts, one for America and one for France. He says:

"We do not yet know whether the United States will permit the development of Germany's open handed skill in American waters, but for ourselves we can draw the necessary conclusions."

"On our own territory we make only one-quarter of the steel that we use for munitions. The rest comes from England and America, mostly from America. We then are dependent for part of our steel supply upon free communication across the Atlantic."

JUDGE BINGHAM TO WED MRS. FLAGLER ON NOV. 15

NEW YORK, Nov. 10.—The engagement of Mrs. Mary Lily Flagler, widow of Henry M. Flagler, builder of the Florida East Coast Railway, to former Judge Robert Worth Bingham of Louisville, Ky., which has been forecast unofficially, was announced formally yesterday here by Mrs. Flagler's brother, William R. Kenan of Lockport.

The wedding will take place in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Pembroke Jones, No. 5 East 84th street, on the afternoon of Nov. 15. The Rev. Dr. George Meran Ward, rector of the Flagler Chapel at Palm Beach, will officiate. Only members of the immediate families will be present. Mrs. Flagler, who inherited an estate estimated at \$70,000,000 when Mr. Flagler died at Palm Beach in 1912, first met former Judge Bingham at commencement exercises of the University of Virginia, twenty-three years ago. They renewed a friendship begun then when they met at a house party in Asheville, N. C., last year. They will maintain residences in Louisville, New York and Palm Beach.

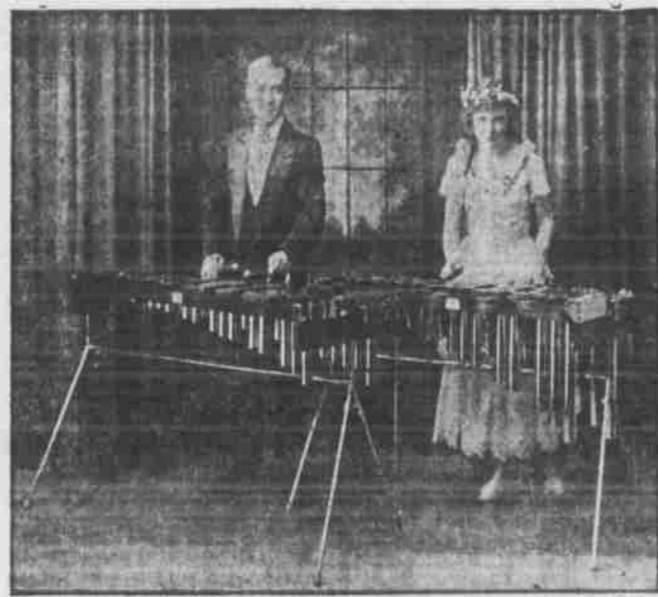
