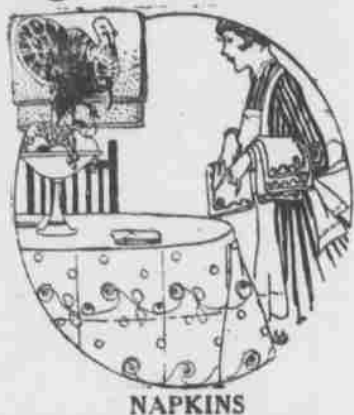

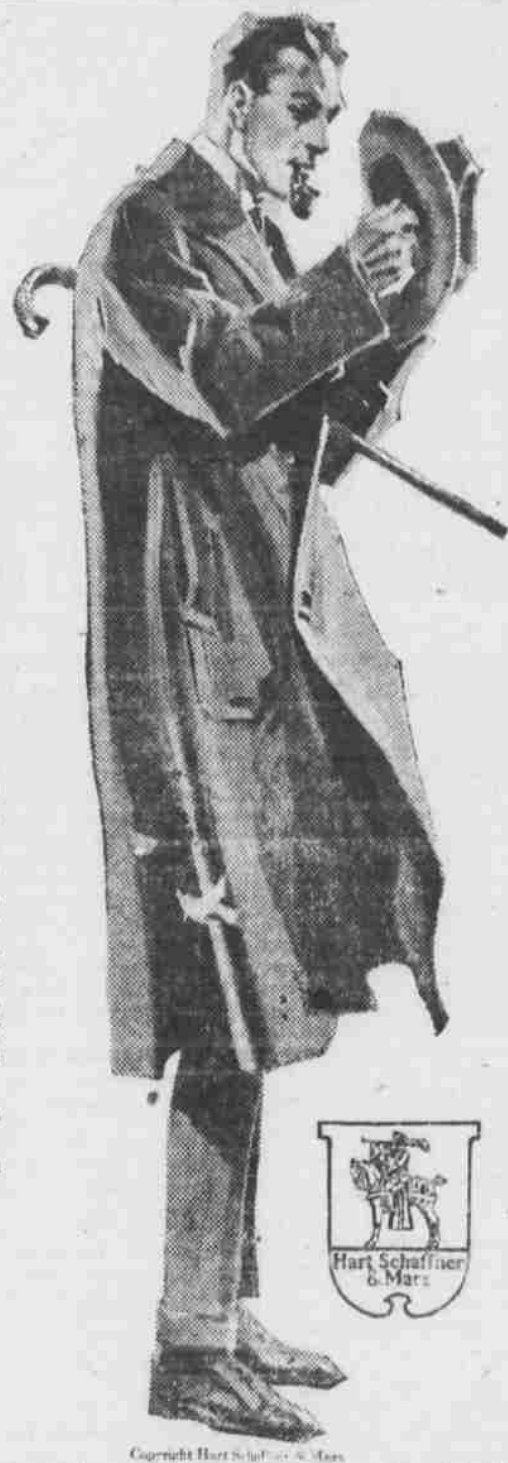

MILK ADVANCE.
IN ST. PAUL TO GO TO GRAND JURY

ST. PAUL, Minn., Nov. 15.—Milk companies here have raised the price of cream from eight cents to nine cents a half pint, and price of milk from four to five cents. The price of milk by the quart remains eight cents, though milk men say it soon must be increased.

Producers in the Minneapolis district at a recent meeting decided that prices must be increased on sales to distributors to return the dairymen 20 cents a gallon. Distributors say that in this case the public will be forced to pay 10 cents a quart for its milk.

Richard D. O'Brien, county prosecutor in St. Paul, is not looking on price agreements with favor, and has promised in newspaper interviews to place the matter of milk price increases, as well as a 10 per cent raise in laundry prices, which went into effect Monday, before the grand jury. He believes that increases in the price of flour are justified by scarcity of wheat, but can see no such valid reason for other raises. Minnesota statutes contain a law forbidding price fixing by agreement and carrying heavy penalties.
