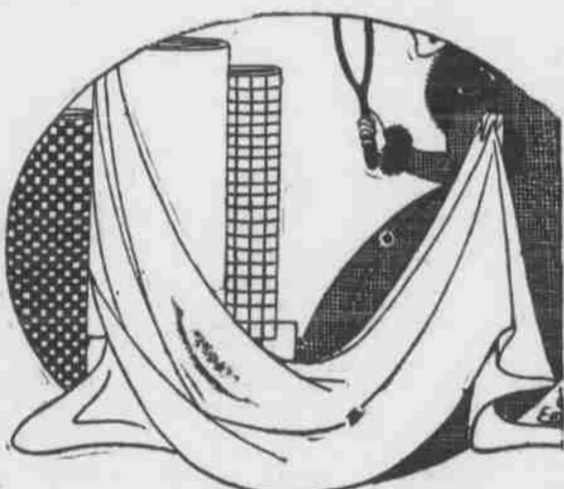

## 'THE DEVIL AT CHURCH' SUBJECT OF SERMON

Evangelist Fagan Gives Interesting Address to Large Audience at the Christian Church.

Evangelist Fagan in the Christian church meetings preached an interesting sermon to a large audience on the unusual subject, "When the Devil Goes to Church." Mr. Fagan based his sermon upon the passage of scripture found in Job, second chapter, first verse, which reads: "Again there was a day when the sons of God came to present themselves before the Lord, and Satan came also among them to present himself before the Lord." It is not surprising to find the devil a regular attendant at church, for Paul says Satan fashions himself into an angel of light. He comes to church to hinder the preacher by suggesting that he compromise with sin or that he refrain from preaching positive doctrines lest some friend have his feelings hurt. He also comes to accuse men of being spiritual graters, of uniting with the church to gain their own selfish ends. He made such accusations against Job but they were proven false. He comes to church to blind men against the gospel, Jesus said: "The cares of the world and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word and it becometh unfruitful." Satan preoccupies men's thoughts with the things of the world and thus blinds them against the gospel.

Satan also comes to church to raise a crop of hypocrites. Yes, there are hypocrites in the church but every one of them belongs to the devil. They are not God's children. The man who hides behind a hypocrite must be smaller than a hypocrite for you can't hide behind a thing that is smaller than you are. Satan also comes to church to snatch away the convictions of men. Men are convicted of sin by the preaching of the gospel. Satan snatches away the word of God by suggesting all manner of excuses.

## ALEXANDER ASTOUNDS BY WONDERFUL WORK

"White Mahatma" Makes Initial Appearance Before Crowded House at Oregon Theater.

Alexander, the "White Mahatma," made his initial appearance at the Oregon theater last night with the house crowded, and showed not only that he is a skillful individual who can befuddle the most astute of ob-

servers, but that he is a very entertaining personage as well. In the second part of the performance, devoted to what he calls the "Sima Seance," he kept the audience in laughter.

The first part of the program is given over to feats of "magic" and Alexander shows himself an adept manipulator. There are many clever illusions, that of the "spirit pictures," in which famous paintings called for by members of the audience are reproduced on a canvass, being particularly mystifying.

Buy it is the "Sima Seance" that most completely provides the novelty of the evening, for the act is unlike anything of the kind heretofore seen here.

People in the audience are invited to write questions which are sealed by the writers. The envelopes are gathered up and placed upon a table which is not approached by Alexander. The latter proceeds to read the ques-

tions and give answers to them in a lightning-like manner while he mingles with his audience, walking the length of the aisle from stage to the foyer. Alexander shows a sense of humor by sprinkling many witticisms through this part of the show and raises many laughs.

The "Sima Seance" must be regarded as a disconcertingly inexplicable performance. Alexander is frank enough to disclaim any clairvoyant or similar powers, but his work is all baffling and decidedly entertaining.
