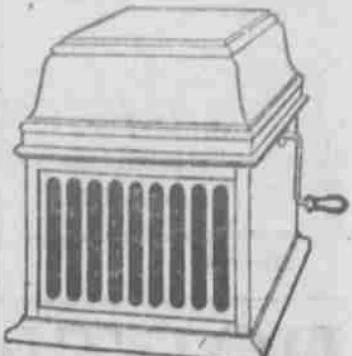
Presbyterian Church Tomorrow.
