### Daily Chats With the Housewife

**BAKSWELL PUDDING.**  
Cover the bottom of a baking dish with 1-8 cup of chopped dates and figs, scalded and dried, and sprinkle 1 cup of bread crumbs over the top. Beat 2 eggs well, add 2 tablespoons of sugar, 1 cup of milk, and 1-4 cup of chopped nuts, and pour over the crumbs. Bake in a moderate oven one hour.

**NEW PETTICOATS.**  
A charming petticoat for the dancing frocks of pink pussy willow tulle with a deep flounce in which are set many bands of white net embroidered with tiny black four leaf clovers. A pink jersey silk petticoat has three full flounces of cream oriental lace, each flounce spread at the edge by a strip of featherbone run underneath. Three roses with attending leaves decorate the three flounces at their headings—all on the left side of the petticoat.

**PUMPKIN TIMBALE.**  
To 1 pint of mashed pumpkin add the yolks of 2 eggs, well beaten, 1 teaspoon of salt and a dash of pepper. Mix well, cut and fold in the stiffly beaten whites of the 2 eggs, then fill custard or timbale cups. Stand in a baking pan of hot water and bake in a moderate oven 20 minutes, or until firm. When done, turn carefully from the cups and serve at once.

**CREAM CAKE.**  
One half pound flour, 1-2 pound sugar, 1-2 pound butter, 3 eggs, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1-4 pint cream, grated lemon rind or rose water. Beat butter and sugar to a cream; add yolks of eggs one by one, beating each well. Sift in the flour, mixed and sifted with baking powder, and lastly cream and whites of eggs beaten stiff.

**POT ROAST (CHUCK).**  
Rub 2 pounds of beef over with vinegar and let it stand for one hour before cooking. Saute till well browned. Add 1 cup of water and simmer till the fiber is tender. Add 1 teaspoonful salt.

**SALISBURY STEAK, PLANKED (CHUCK).**  
Grind the meat three times. To 1 pound of meat use 1 tablespoon of lemon juice and 1 teaspoon of salt. Mold into form of steak on plank placed in hot oven and, after 5 minutes reduce the heat. Cook 12 to 15 minutes, if liked medium.

**SWISS STEAK.**  
Take a round steak, one inch thick, place on a floured meat board and cover with flour. Pound in flour with the edge of a plate, till meat is tender. Pan-broil. Season with salt and 1-4 teaspoon pepper, dot over with one tablespoon butter.

**FRENCH STEAK.**  
Strip one skirt steak of fat. Remove the membrane. Lay the steak on a board, place the fat at each end and roll. Skewer. Cut in one-inch slices and oven-broil 20 minutes. To oven broil, put wire rack over a plate or dripping pan with a little hot water.

**CROQUETTES IN PAPER BAG.**  
Mix together one part ground meat to two parts of tomato sauce. For the sauce, three tablespoons of flour, three tablespoons butter, one cup of tomato liquor, 1-4 teaspoon of salt, 1-4 teaspoon of pepper. Shape the croquettes, one tablespoon of mixture in a ball. Roll in bread crumbs, then in beaten egg. Then in bread crumbs again. Grease the inside of the bag well. Place croquettes in bag carefully. Close the bag by folding top over and fastening with paper clips or pins. Place in hot oven for 20 minutes.

**Wet Umbrellas.**  
Do not open a wet umbrella to dry it. Wipe it down with an old soft silk handkerchief and leave it to drain in a bath or basin, shut up.

**To Revive a Fire.**  
Dried orange peel revives a neglected fire more thoroughly and quicker than anything else, but is a very noisy and sputtery remedy.

**Removing Onion Smell.**  
The disagreeable smell of onions which clings to pots and pans so stubbornly can quickly be removed by washing and drying the pans, scouring with common salt, and placing on the stove until the salt is brown. Shake often, then wash the pan as usual.

**Prevents Hands Chapping.**  
To prevent your hands chapping always wash them in cold water; but if this is too Spartan for you, dusting them over with a little toilet oatmeal after each washing will sometimes prevent it.

**Washing Hairbrushes.**  
To wash hairbrushes, mix together a tablespoonful of liquid ammonia, about a quart of water. Do not wet the back of the brush. Rinse in clear cold water.

**To Keep Milk From Burning.**  
Milk will burn quite easily, but this can be rectified in the following way: Pour the boiling milk into a clean pitcher and stand in a basin of cold water until quite cool.

**Ironing Hooks and Eyes.**  
In ironing a garment on which hooks are sewn, care should be taken not to close the hooks. You can prevent this by placing a flannel or anything soft beneath the hooks.
