#### THRILLS, LOVE AND PATHOS APLENTY IN "THE LAST MAN"

Remarkable Feats Performed in Thrilling Action of Story. "The Last Man," the Vitagraph Blue Ribbon feature, in five parts, with an all star cast, including William Duncan, Mary Anderson, Corinne Griffith, Jack Mower, and Otto Lederer is the attraction at the Pastime theater on Sunday and Monday.

This picture is overflowing with thrills—real thrills—the kind every audience loves to experience. One scene in particular is a most risky one.

The story calls for William Duncan to carry Jack Mower on his back in order to escape from the Indians who are on the war path. Corinne Griffith, too, is in the picture.

The only means of escape is to cross a certain hand-made bridge which spans a deep chasm in which the turbulent waters of a mountain stream flow. This bridge is suspended from two trees and is high in the air. It is constructed from rope and narrow slates and, as the players cross it can be seen to shake dangerously from side to side. It is a well known fact that such bridges have a tendency to overturn and it was only through the greatest courage on the part of the players that this bridge was used.

The first party crossed over in safety—then the story called for the pursuing Indians to follow. Naturally the bridge had to be destroyed so William Duncan cut the rope. The Indians were not the result of much make-up—they were the genuine article, otherwise this part of the story would have had to be eliminated.

When the rope is cut the bridge turns turtle, throwing its burden of over half a dozen men into the current beneath. A camera-man was stationed below on a bank of the stream to catch their fall while another stood on a high hill to one side. That is the reason that this fall is one of the most thrilling ever filmed.

Pretty Corinne Griffith was unable to work for the rest of the day after this perilous scene had been taken—particularly after the Indians had fallen into the stream. For once, it twice it appeared impossible for the rescue party to reach the last man who fell from the dangling rope. In fact, the entire company suffered from nervousness for the next two or three days, so realistic was the fall of the Indians.

This is only one of the many genuine thrills contained in "The Last Man," the picture that has received excellent criticisms wherever shown.

A remarkable screen story dealing with an important but little known part of the present great world struggle is the attraction at the Alta Sunday and Monday.

"The Intrigue," the Pallas-Paramount photoplay starring beautiful Lenore Ulrich deals with the secret service and the international intrigue for possession of a marvelous invention—an X-ray gun that annihilates at a distance of 25 miles.
