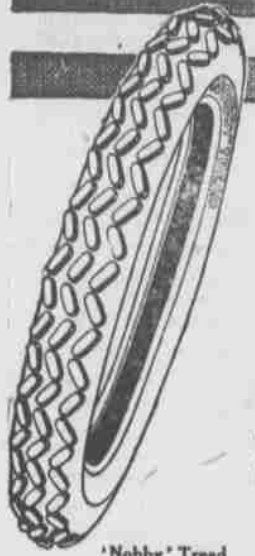

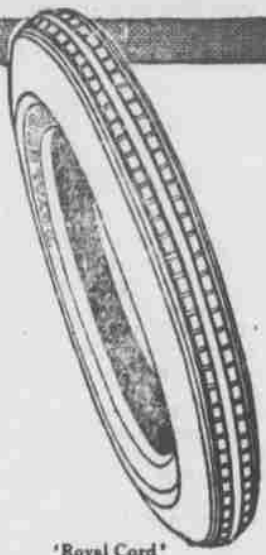
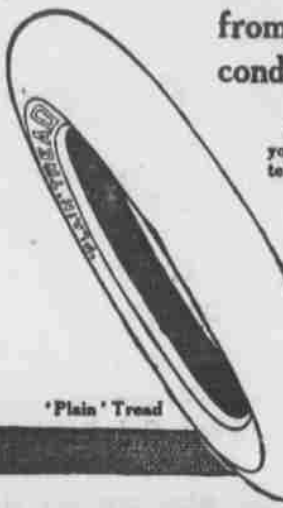

German Lutheran Service.

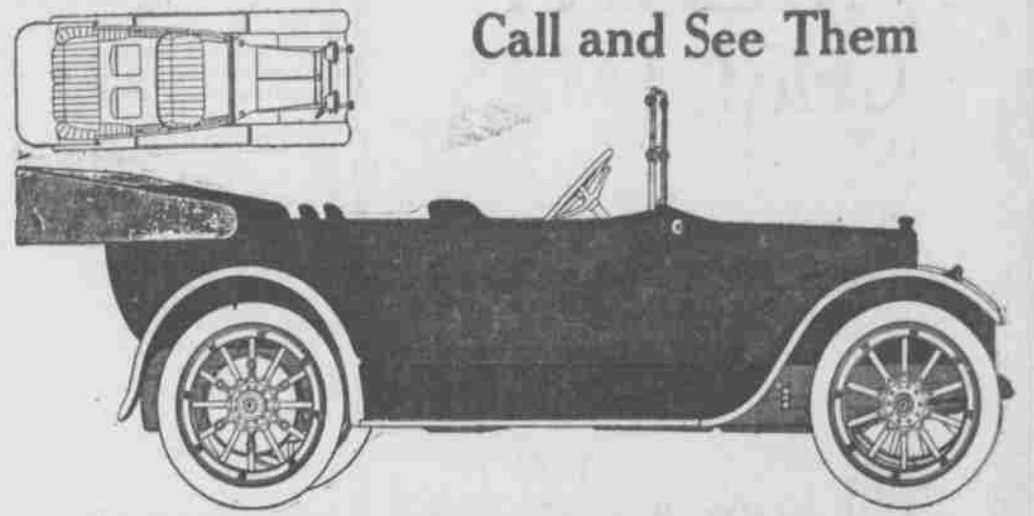

Father Tries to Bury Child.

NEW YORK, Dec. 23.—Unable to bear the expense of having an undertaker bury the baby girl born to his wife in Bellevue Hospital a few days ago, Joseph Gardner, thirty-seven years old, of No. 216 Amsterdam Avenue, Manhattan, took the child to Greenwood Cemetery, in Brooklyn yesterday in a cardboard box and tried to bury it himself.

Gravediggers interfered with the result. Gardner was arraigned before Magistrate Dodd, charged with attempting burial without a permit and not having conformed with the regulations of the health department. Magistrate Dodd paroled the prisoner until today, and told him to take the baby to the Manhattan morgue. Unless somebody comes forth with

the necessary money, the baby will be buried in Potter's Field.

Veteran Dug Own Grave.
ALTON, N. H., Dec. 23.—Dana B. Watson, aged eighty-four, a Lynn, Mass., Civil War veteran, has been buried in the grave he dug for himself a few days ago in his family lot in the cemetery of this town. He felt himself failing in health about two weeks ago and came here to prepare his grave. It took him three days to complete the grave and line it with cement. Then he returned to Lynn after covering the grave with a wooden cover to keep out the rain. A week ago he told his friends in the Grand Army hall in Lynn that he had his grave all ready and that he expected to live but a short while longer.
