

WITH RETURN OF HEAVY SNOWS AUTOS ARE ALMOST PUT OUT OF COMMISSION,

France Has Over 1000 Dogs With All Sleds and Necessary Equipment for Performing Much Transport Ser-

(By Henry Wood, United Press Staff Correspondent.)

WITH THE FRENCH ARMIES IN THE VOSGES, Jan. 20 .- (By Mail.) -- With the return of heavy snows in the Vosges, Alaskan dog teams are vieing with the automobile drivers of the American ambulance and the members of the Norwegian Red Cross Skil Corps for the honor of bringing

in the greatest number of wounded. The Alaskan sted dogs, gathered in the United States' most northwest territory, constitute the latest "war mabeing supplied from America o France. Although the allies, through their supreme mastery of the eas, are able to-gather war supplies in any and all parts of the world, the Alaskan dogs are conceded the honor of coming from the most point, and over the greatest distance, on which the ailies have yet been obliged to draw.

The original number of sled dogs brought to the Vosges from Alaska numbered about 500. These have bred and multiplied so rapidly that France now has at her disposal over 1000 dogs with all of the sleds and material necessary for performing an incredible amount of transport service in the snow clad altitudes of the Vos-

It is principally in the Voscas that the members of the American ambulance have been assigned to duty Their light, speedy cars not only en able them to scale all the peaks on which roads have been built, but even to leave the roads themselves in the direction of the first line trenches for the purpose of picking up the wound.

In these Alphine regions, however there are hundreds of places which even the light American cars with their absolutely fearless drivers cannot reach, and it is in these districts that the Alaskan dog team and the Norwegian Red Cross Skill corps come in for the bulk of the work. The Norwegian Skii Corps. fully equipped for field ambulance work volunteered its service to France, the same as the American ambulance, and has already done valuant service.

The Alaskan dog service, however, was thought out and organized by the French army itself, which sent experts to Alaska, Labrador and Canada white they are practically invisible ing him with a million-miles-away approach within a comparatively short distance of the German lines for the purpose of picking up the wounded without being fired on. Seven dogs with one of the long Alaskan sleds and a single driver can pick up a dressing station with remarkable

Ambulance work, however, is only a small portion of the duties assigned the dogs, and they are a considerable portion of the transport service of the Griffith has used in reproducing the French army in the Vosges. They carry munitions, food and water to all
