NORTH YAKIMA, Wash., Jan. 22.—The body of Christopher O'Toole, a trapper well known to Central Washington, was found frozen west of North Yakima today. The coroner said his investigation developed that O'Toole fractured his skull by a fall on the ice. Papers in his pockets show bank deposits of several thousand dollars.

25 WITNESSES HEARD, MOONEY MURDER CASE
 SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 23.—Twenty-five witnesses testified for the prosecution today in the trial of Thomas J. Mooney, one of five alleged conspirators held responsible for a bomb explosion here last July which resulted in ten deaths.
 Witnesses after witness, many of whom were at the scene of the explosion when it happened, told of picking up pieces of iron pipe, bits of steel, slugs, cartridges and other missiles which were scattered broadcast by the blast. Several physicians told of treating victims of the various forty who were injured by the explosion.
 One witness, who was subjected to a rapid fire cross examination by Attorney W. Bourke Cochran heading Mooney's defense, declared that he had picked up two rings commonly found on alarm clocks. The prosecution contends that the infernal machine was exploded by a time clock device. Cochran said that it was hardly probable that two rings could

have come from one clock and asked that the witness be ordered to the stand again tomorrow with his notes. Cochran intimated that this witness, who testified to having found the trial of Warren K. Billings on a murder charge growing out of the explosion had been influenced by the district attorney's office.
 Two other witnesses, both boys, testified to finding after the explosion several small articles that the prosecution claimed were parts of an electrical device necessary to have exploded the bomb.

RABID COPOTES RAID JAMES CRAM'S FARM
 They Bite Dogs, Which Will Have to Be Killed, Drive Family to Cover and Attack Livestock.

PRINEVILLE, Jan. 23.—Several mad copotes today attacked the dogs and stock on the James Cram ranch, a few miles east of this city. All the Cram's dogs were bitten and will have to be killed.

When the stock was attacked the family living on the ranch attempted to drive off the coyotes but were themselves forced to seek refuge in the house. The family were only temporarily on the ranch having gone there yesterday after their house was burned on the Douglas Johnson ranch near by.

James Cram is in a Portland hospital under treatment for injuries received a week ago in which he lost an eye.

Not to Investigate Deaths.
 BOISE, Ida., Jan. 23.—The lower house of the Idaho legislature voted today not to investigate the death of four members of the Idaho national guard camped at Boise barracks. The lower house later voted to have its military committee confer informally with the military authorities and the men at the barracks. The senate passed a similar resolution.
