WALTER PIERCE IS RE-ELECTED PRESIDENT

State Taxpayers Association
Has Large Number of Leg-
islators in List.

SALEM, Or., Jan. 27.—Senator La Follett's bill cutting off the industrial welfare commission from state aid and a bill to provide for emergency appropriations in case of the burning of a state building, are the main topics under discussion by the Oregon Taxpayers' league, now in annual session here. Resolutions covering these points were sent to the committee on resolutions, along with a number of minor matters.

It is likely that the committee will report adversely on the La Follett bill, which takes away the state aid of one-seventh of the amount contributed to the fund by employer and employee. The resolution suggesting that the board of control be authorized to issue certificates of indebtedness when state buildings burn is said to be favored by the committee.

A hard fight in open meeting on the La Follett resolution is freely predicted. Paul Turner of Portland, here in the interest of the La Follett bill, is attending the meeting.

The resolutions committee is composed of C. E. Spence, state grange chairman; R. E. Brodie, editorial association; Henry Reed, Multnomah county assessor; George Miller, Union county; Elbert Bode, Willamette Valley Editorial association; James Stewart, state grange, and O. W. Taylor, Portland.

The old officers of the league were re-elected; Walter Pierce, state senator, president; C. L. Hawley, state senator; Alce La Follett, state senator; and John Westerlund, Medford, vice-presidents; R. E. Smith, editor of the Tax Liberator, Roseburg, secretary-treasurer; and R. N. Stanfield, speaker of the house, chairman of the finance committee.

Before one of the strong political affiliations of the league it is expected that its recommendations regarding proposed legislation will find strong support in both branches of the legislature.

HORSE SERUM TO FIGHT INFANTILE PARALYSIS

CHICAGO, Jan. 27.—Many babies in Chicago next fall owe their lives to two horses. Dr. John W. Nuzum, resident pathologist at the Cook county hospital, who developed a new and efficient serum for the cure of infantile paralysis, is relying on horses to obtain enough serum to meet an epidemic which, it is feared,

will break forth in Chicago this summer.

Two young and virile horses have been obtained and they will be immunized. From them enough of Dr. Nuzum's serum, "poliomyelitis," will be developed to cure 2000 cases of the disease. It will take about three months to get the necessary serum.

Heretofore sheep have been used, but Dr. Nuzum says that to obtain a large supply of the serum horses will be necessary.

Dr. Nuzum says the serum has

proved satisfactory so far, but that it will take a great number of cases breaking forth at once to really gauge its worth.

RAILROAD WILL HELP BRING PROJECT SETTLERS

"Farmer" Smith Makes Propo-
sition With the Hermiston
Commercial Club.

HERMISTON, Jan. 27.—"Farmer" Smith of the O.-W. R. & N. Co., was in the city this week, and made a proposition with the Commercial Club, whereby the railroad company will send a map east to rustic more settlers for the project. The stipulations are, that they secure a contract with the owner of each piece of land for sale, that the same will be sold at the figure named, which the Commercial club agrees is not unreasonable, and that the land is adapted for the purposes stated. The contract will show number of acres in the tract, price per acre, and the terms of sale. Any land for sale is to be put in the hands of the Commercial club and appraised by a board of appraisers named by them.

"Farmer" Smith promised that the railroad company would furnish seed corn for any farmer who would erect a silo during the year, and if it was money that was keeping him from it, he would arrange that the same could be borrowed and paid back from the cream check. The railroad company sent an expert here this fall to superintend the filling of the silos.

charge of larceny. Mrs. Ross says Woodward, after a long correspondence, induced her to come to Pittsburg to wed him. Arriving with her two children Woodward met her, borrowed her jewelry and available cash and disappeared. Mrs. Ross played the role of detective, found him with another woman, called the police and personally saw him put in a cell.
