LIVESTOCK MARKET VERY GOOD

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 28.—Livestock market conditions at North Portland were of the most favorable type during the last week. There was general strength in all lines and once again it was demonstrated that everything considered, the shipper is assured of a square deal by shipping to this city. There was a slight decrease in the volume of hog offerings at North Portland for the week, as compared with the previous six days. Totals for the week were 5476 head, while those of the last week were 6025 head. A year ago for the same week the run totaled 7344 head.
