FEDERATION WANTS TO UNIONIZE PHONE GIRLS

Resolution Adopted at Everett Pledging Support to National Peace Policy.

EVERETT, Wash., Jan. 27.—The Washington State Federation of Labor ended its annual convention here today. Just before adjournment the convention adopted resolutions asking President Wilson to appoint David J. Lewis to a cabinet position, preferably postmaster-general; favoring the organization into labor unions of telephone operators; pledging support to a national peace policy and levying a per capita tax of 25 cents on federation members to carry on referendum work at the close of the present session of the state legislature.

NOT A SOU FOUND IN BANK WHEN THE POLICE SEARCHED

PARIS, Jan. 29.—An alleged swindle estimated by different newspapers as amounting from \$500,000 to \$2,000,000 has been disclosed by the arrest of Philippe Simeoni of Italian origin, and Prince Henri de Broglie-Revel.

Simeoni was accused in 1912 of cheating Prince Friedrich Carl zu Hohenlohe-Oehringen out of \$100,000. The case was settled out of court, but Simeoni was sentenced to six months' reclusion. Afterward he founded the Comptoir des Valeurs Industrielles, a stock broking bank.
