Pictures taken on the battlefields of Belgium during actual fighting between the armies of the Allies and the central powers will be shown on the screen at the Alta theater on Thursday, matinee and evening, when Dr. Earl Morrow delivers a lecture on the work of the American Red Cross in the Flanders sector. Dr. Morrow was for a year and a half in charge of the work of 53 doctors and over 400 nurses, and saw some of the most terrific encounters of the war on the front. By special permission of King Albert, of Belgium, he was permitted to take pictures from the first line trenches, and it is these pictures that he uses to illustrate his lecture.

For the services that he rendered the wounded, Dr. Morrow was made a chevalier of the order of Leopold, and one of his most cherished posses-

sions is the cross of the Belgian Legion of Honor that was presented to him by King Albert. Dr. Morrow will tell of his experiences in succoring the wounded, of the wonderful work done by the American surgeons and of adventures he experienced while in the trenches. His lecture gives an intimate and exact picture of the life most of the men in the Old World are leading today and is virtually a page torn out of the modern history that is being made on the shell-torn battlefields.

Desmond Emulates Fairbanks. It is not so easy to scramble over the high iron fence surrounding the Triangle-Kay Bee Cigar city studios. William Desmond knows just how difficult it is because he has done it five or six times before the camera.

The fence is eight feet high, of ornate iron, with spikes in the effect of spears pointing upward, and crossbars extending horizontally every two feet.

Desmond, who has the leading role in "The Iced Bullet," is supposed to be a poor scenario writer, who endeavored to sell his manuscript to Thos. H. Ince, and who, in order to get on the "lot," is obliged to escape the watchful eye and 300 pound bulk of the guardian at the gate.

In order to do this, Desmond leaps over the iron fence, and this he had to do a number of times before he could finally trust himself before the camera. Although he is an exceptionally powerful athlete, Desmond had never made a specialty of high jumping, and it took a lot of practice before he could turn the trick.

### NEW ROAD CODE.

on grouse is not changed, on ducks and geese changed to conform to the federal law. The trout limit is reduced from 25 to 20 per day, the deer limit from three to two bucks, and one important change is the closing of the winter fishing for trout. This was accomplished through raising the limit from 10 inches to 15 inches. This will permit the fishermen to fish for steelheads only.

Chattel Mortgage Law. There are two migratory chattel mortgage laws. One pertains to automobiles. This provides that when a mortgage is given on an automobile the recorder of conveyances sends a certificate to the state treasurer and thereafter the chattel mortgage is effective in any county in the state. The other migratory chattel mortgage law is intended to protect the mortgagee of livestock. It provides that when the owner of the mortgaged property desires to move the chattel out of the county he must give the owner of the mortgage ten days notice.

Of course, every one is familiar with the road bond bill, which will be voted on at the special election held June 1. It provides for issuing bonds in the sum of \$5,000,000 for the purpose of building state highways.

Supervisors Abolished. The new road code does away with the present system of road supervisors, places the road work of the county in charge of a road master who must be an engineer, permits districts to be formed for the purpose of levying road taxes and building their own roads, etc. Its intent is to give the
