NO FAT POLICE NOR THIN ONES FOR STOCKTON
STOCKTON, March 6.—No man whose waist measurement exceeds that of his chest need apply for appointment on the Stockton police force if the provision of a set of rules and regulations introduced by Police Commissioner Charles O. Smith are adopted by the city council.
The proposed ordinance expressly states that fat men are not wanted on the force. The provision, however, does not apply to present members of the force, so several Stockton coppers are breathing easier.
Here are the physical specifications for policemen embodied in the ordinance:
Height not less than 5 feet 9 in-ches nor more than 6 feet 4 inches, weight, not less than 150 nor more than 235 pounds, according to height.
These provisions would eliminate Floyd Brown, Stockton's tallest policeman, who has now an appointment. Brown is 6 feet 9 inches in his stockings and is said to be the tallest policeman in California. Applicants must be between the ages of 25 and 35 years, and efficient in bicycle riding.
Commissioner Smith proposed that no man should be appointed chief of police who had not served ten years continuously on the police force, two as police captain and three as police detective. This provision has already been eliminated by the other commissioners.
The ordinance would prohibit police officers from becoming quoted in the newspapers.
