French Surgeon Replaces Eyes, Cheeks, Brows, Shot Away by Germans in Battle.

PARIS, March 9 .- In all the world here are just an even dozen manufac turors of artificial eyes. Eleven make glass eyes. There is one each in New York, London and Venice. Of the other nine, four are in Germany and five in Paris. Among these there is a man apart, an artist, Dr. Robert Coulomb, who makes artificial eyes of strystal and enamel so startingly like the living orb that at a distance of 12 feet from a patient providing the livng eye is immobile, it is absolutely mible to distinguish which can
