BOISE, Idaho, March 10.—Fleas of not guilty to a charge of conspiracy in violation of the Sherman anti-trust act, in the creamery business, were entered today in the United States court by A. P. Henningsen, Portland, W. P. Henningsen, Butte; Carl Schallinger, Portland; R. A. Goodhue, Spokane; Henningsen Produce company; Butter; Schallinger Produce company, Portland; Hazledwood company, Portland; Commercial Creamery company, Spokane, and the Hazelwood company, limited, Spokane.

All of the 11 corporations and 5 individuals indicted have now pleaded except R. E. Corlies of Seattle, who has been granted until Monday on account of delay in his notice, and the Klock Produce company, Seattle.

### FOOD-LADEN VESSELS CROWD BRITISH DOCKS

England's Answer to Diver Blockade is Immense Warehouses Holding Tremendous Supplies of Meats and Grain.

LONDON, March 10.—In answer to Germany's contention that her submarines are starving Great Britain, the government took a party of neutral correspondents on a three-day tour of the greater merchant shipping centers of the kingdom—Liverpool, Manchester and London.

The correspondents were permitted to see miles of docks filled with shipping unloading from all quarters of the world, or loading for outward voyages.

Immense warehouses in Liverpool, Manchester and London were inspected in detail, showing unbelievable stores of meat, grain and cotton.

The Manchester Ship Canal corporation entertained the guests, pointing with pride to the fact that increasing tonnage made it possible a fortnight ago to pay a first dividend on the common stock for the corporation.

At Manchester alone correspondents were shown 100,000 tons of wheat in elevators, in ships or at the docks.

One warehouse at the Victoria & Albert docks at London contained 17,000 tons of frozen mutton.

The conclusion was forced that if sufficient stores, exists in England to keep the country supplied with food the country is safe, because the elevators and warehouses are all full.

TURNER OLIVER, LA GRANDE MAN, NAMED REGISTRAR AT SPOKANE.

A. W. Cauthorn of Portland to Be Director, D. G. O'Shea of Montana, Chosen President.

WASHINGTON, March 12.—Announcement was made Saturday by the federal farm loan board of the following appointments of officers and directors for the Federal Land Bank of Spokane, Wash.:

President and director, D. G. O'Shea, Red Lodge, Mont.

Vice president and director, C. E. B. Roberts, Rupert, Idaho.

Secretary and director, George C. Jewett, Pullman, Wash.

Treasurer and director, George M. Dreher, Spokane, Wash.

Director, A. W. Cauthorn, Portland Ore.

Registrar and attorney, Turner Oliver, La Grande, Ore.

Treasury department statement regarding appointments says in part: O'Shea, by sheer ability, has built up a large banking institution at Red Lodge, has devoted efforts to building the great northwest, and has gained extensive knowledge of problems of agriculture. He is owner of farms, interested in merchandising, a large stock raiser and member of the Montana senate.

Roberts is cattle grower.

Jewett is treasurer of Idaho State Grange and has intimate knowledge of problems and needs. He is president of the Jersey Cattle Growers' association, has intimate knowledge of business, having served as bank director; is a practical farmer and deep student of agriculture.

Dreher has had 16 years' experience in banking and farm loan business and is intimately acquainted with financial needs of farmers in the Spokane district.

Dreher has had 15 years' experience in the banking business at Spokane, is thoroughly familiar with land values and is an expert accountant.
