**Tax Collection Closes.**  
Thursday evening closed the first half of the tax collecting season. The amount paid into the sheriff's office during the time specified for the payment of the first half will not be known for several days owing to the congestion caused by the last hour rush.

**Heppner Shooters Coming.**  
Dan Howman, one of the local scattergun experts, has received a long distance telephone message from Heppner announcing that a number of the trapshooters of that city will be here Sunday to shoot with the Pendleton men in the tournament shoot.

**Pilot Rock Patriotic.**  
By way of proclaiming to the world the patriotism of Pilot Rock people, the residents of that town yesterday set up a tall flagpole in the center of the leading street intersection and have raised a huge flag, according to Deputy Warden George Tonkin who was there yesterday.

**Stores Close For Good Friday.**  
In observance of Good Friday almost all of the business houses of Pendleton closed yesterday afternoon from 1 until 2 o'clock while services were held at the Episcopal and Catholic churches. This is the first time such observance has been given Good Friday in Pendleton for several years.

**Funeral of Mrs. Nims.**  
The funeral of Mrs. Mattie Nims, 45, who died at the Eastern Oregon State Hospital Wednesday night, was held at the Brown chapel this afternoon at 2 o'clock and interment was made at Otway cemetery. Mrs. Nims and her husband were both sent to the hospital from La Pine, Oregon. The husband died a short time ago.

**Art Teacher Leaving.**  
Miss Florence Lusted, who had had charge of the art department at the Washington schools, left last evening for Iowa. She intends attending the Iowa normal school until the end of the term, and then going to Chicago for advanced work in art. She has been granted a leave of absence from the local schools.

**Funeral Of Mrs. Hall.**  
The funeral of Mrs. Lillian M. Hall, wife of E. E. Hall, an auto mechanic in the employ of the Simpson Auto Co., was held this morning at 9 o'clock from the Brown chapel. Mrs. Hall died on April 4 at Astoria where she had been in a sanatorium. Peritonitis was the cause of death. Mr. and Mrs. Hall moved to Pendleton about 18 months ago from Spokane.
