PORTLAND, April 11.—While new high records were established for hogs in practically all the markets east of the Rockies during the day, there was no change in the North Portland situation. In fact, there was really nothing available here that would bring even previous top quotations.

Whereas, the City Surveyor of The City of Pendleton did on the 4th day of April, 1917, under direction and by requirement of the Common Council file in the office of the Recorder of The City of Pendleton, plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of the following named street in said city, Madison Street from the North line of Jackson Street to the South line of Wilson Street, together with estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof with a statement as to the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement, and the percentage of the total cost of improvement, which each of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land should pay on account of the benefits to be derived from such improvement, and

Whereas, the Council has examined such plans and specifications and estimates and found the same satisfactory and the estimates therefor to be in accordance with the probable cost of such work, and

Whereas, the property recommended by the City Surveyor to be included within the boundaries of the District benefited is in the judgment of the Common Council proper to be included within such improvement district and no property is excluded therefrom which should properly be included therein, and

Whereas, the improvement of the hereinbefore described portions of Madison Street with Gravel Bitulithic Pavement is at this time necessary, therefore, be it

Resolved, that the plans and specifications and estimates for such improvement as prepared by the City Surveyor and filed with the recorder of The City of Pendleton on the 4th day of April, 1917, be and they are hereby adopted, and be it further

Resolved, that the cost of making such improvement shall be a charge and lien upon all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement, and the owners of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land so specially benefited by such improvement shall be liable for the payment of the costs thereof, and be it further

DRESDEN EATING ELEPHANT STEAK

Jumbo, Giant Trick Performer, Is Carved Up Because of His Bad Temper.

BERLIN, April 10.—Elephant steak will soon be an available delicacy for the Dresden epicures, according to a report received here. Jumbo, the giant trick elephant, has come under the butcher's cleaver, and Dresden's meat supply has been increased two towns thereby. A well known "meat tavern" acquired Jumbo's carcass for 3000 marks (about \$2250), and a telegram to the Berlin Gazette concludes, "The flesh will be made serviceable for human nutrition."

To avoid misapprehensions regarding food conditions in Dresden, it was not the meat shortage, but Jumbo's own bad temper, unfitting him for show purposes, which was the immediate cause of his slaughter.
