### "WAR HAS BECOME ONE VAST FACTORY"

Deputy Tardieu Tells Paris Paper "America Can Send Workers Very Soon."

PARIS, April 18.—In an unusually frank article, Deputy Andre Tardieu, a leading parliamentary authority on foreign affairs, writes to the Petit Parisien regarding war-time relations

with the United States. He urges that the Entente have a common program in asking help of the United States, and points to danger if the four principal nations make separate demands.

He divides American aid into four kinds: Finance, transportation, industry and man-power. With regard to the last he observes:

"I hear it said American soldiers will arrive too late. But who can fix the date of peace? Who can venture to assert that in 1918 American reinforcements of half a million men or more will not have irresistible value."

By the side of the combatant activities there are the non-combatant laboring activities. America can very soon send its workmen. Our need in this respect in the war zone as well as elsewhere is for hundreds of thousands of men, for the war both at the front and in the rear, has become one vast factory."

### NAVY GAINS 4871 MEN, NET, IN FIRST 12 DAYS OF APRIL

Total Enlisted Strength Is Nearing 70,000—New Recruiting Campaign Showing Results.

WASHINGTON, April 18.—The new recruiting campaign for the navy is beginning to show results. For the first 12 days of April a net gain of 4871 men for the regular service is recorded. The total enlisted strength is approaching the 70,000 mark. President Wilson has already authorized recruitment to 57,000, the maximum allowed by law, and pending legislation will provide for a total force of 137,000, including the coast defense reserve, the only present volunteer element.

When the 57,000 figure shall have been reached it is possible that subsequent enlistments will be permitted for the duration of the war, which would enable the active service to be filled up with war volunteers.  
Encouraging reports are coming from commandants of the various naval districts to whom has been left the task of organizing the personnel of the coast and harbor and patrol service.

### NAMES COINED IN THE NAVY

When these were first constructed they were variously designed as "iron," "steel" or "armor-plated," and even about "plated" there was a difference of opinion, for "cased," "clothed" and "sided" served at various times as alternatives.  
In fact, these ships' official designation until 1866 was "iron-plated." "Platiship" again in a nautical parlance of the official "line-of-battle ship."
