ALLIED DIPLOMATS CONFER WITH U. S.



Plans for the active cooperation of the United States with the allies in the prosecution of the war against Germany are being laid in frequent conferences between the diplomatic representatives of the allied governments and American state and war officials.

Sir Cecil Spring-Rice, ambassador from Great Britain; M. J. Jusserand, ambassador from France, and M. Bakhmeteff, ambassador from Russia, are holding almost daily meetings with Secretary of State Lansing, Secretary of the Navy Daniels and Secretary of War Baker.

LIVE NEWS OF THE NORTHWEST

MEACHAM, Ore., April 20.—Mr. and Mrs. John Casey, newlyweds, lived on love alone for 25 hours, thereby probably establishing a record for ability to exist on nothing but kisses. On their honeymoon from Enterprise to La Grande the train was stalled by a snowslide for 25 hours. There was no food on the train.

PORTLAND, Ore., April 20.—Who lost a potato? Patrolman Post found a spud on the sidewalk at Third and Yamhill. He took it to the police headquarters and today it is safely put away in the room devoted to lost valuable property. Post's report states that he recommended that the detective bureau be put to work to find the owner.

ASTORIA, Ore., April 20.—That highly prized jewel—the 1917 potato—will be grown in Astoria plenty this spring. The Girls' Honor Guard, recently organized, will work a large tract of ground donated by a railroad company. The girls say they will mine the potato field themselves next summer.

TACOMA, Wash., April 20.—The mobilization of a large body of regular army troops and the units of the new army to be raised by the government in its preparation for active participation in the European war will begin at American Lake within the next few weeks. It became known today. The county commissioners took action to provide the government immediately with 20,000 of the 70,000 acres which will be condemned for an army post site. The tract is expected to become the scene of feverish activity in a few days, preparing it for the coming mobilization.

GERMAN HAS HIS SON ENLISTED
YORKUM, Tex., April 20.—Naval recruiting officers here were forced to look for an interpreter when G. Holmes of Sibley, Tex., personally brought his 17-year-old son, Otto, for enlistment in the navy. Holmes, a farmer, was born in Germany and cannot speak the English language. Through an interpreter he said: "Please accept my son. It is my offering to America."

FLAG OF U. S. LEP CANADIAN CHARGE
OTTAWA, April 18.—When the Canadians charged up the long slope of Vimy Ridge, the Stars and Stripes went before them into the German fire. The story is told in an official dispatch received today from Canadian headquarters in France. A young Texan, who had journeyed all the way from his home to Ontario to enlist, carried with him a little American flag. When the United States declared war and when he found that his regiment was chosen to form part of the first wave of men storming Vimy ridge he took the flag out and tied it to his bayonet. So it was that the Germans had their first view of the flag of their newest enemy within a few days of the declaration of war. The Texas boy carried his flag out to the very front, but in the assault on Thelus, near the southern end of the ridge, he fell with a bullet through his body. He is now in hospital, and it is not known whether he will recover.

Girls Will be in Yeoman Service; Called for All Walks of Life.

EUGENE, Ore., April 16.—Several hundred Eugene people went to the Southern Pacific station in a downpour of rain last night to cheer the first citizens to join the colors as members of the naval reserve.

Six members of the party that left last night for the Bremerton navy-yard were girls who have enrolled as yeomen in the navy. A second party of 25 reserves will leave tonight. The call has taken men and women from every civil activity in the city, including the city council, chamber of commerce, police department, banks, newspapers, church organizations and the University of Oregon football eleven.
