WASHINGTON, April 23.—More than 16,000 applications have been received by the war department for commissions in the officers' reserve corps. The department will ask congress for appropriations to pay salaries of those attending training camps, but in the meantime will ask those who have passed examinations to attend camps pending consideration by congress. Transportation and subsistence also will be paid.

RUSS FOOD STORES EXPROPRIATED FOR GOVERNMENT USE

Harvest of 1916 and 1917 Must Be Placed at Disposal of State.

LONDON, April 23.—A Petrograd dispatch to Reuter's says that the provisional government has ordered all reserves of the 1916 harvest of corn and cereals which are fit for fodder to be placed at the disposal of the state. The entire reserves of the 1917 harvest, except what is required for seed and the needs of families of the peasants, has also been expropriated.

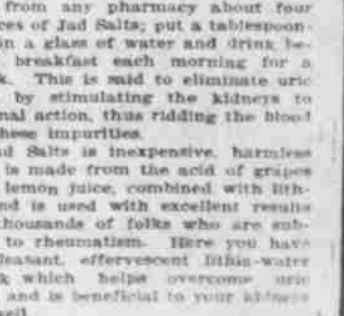

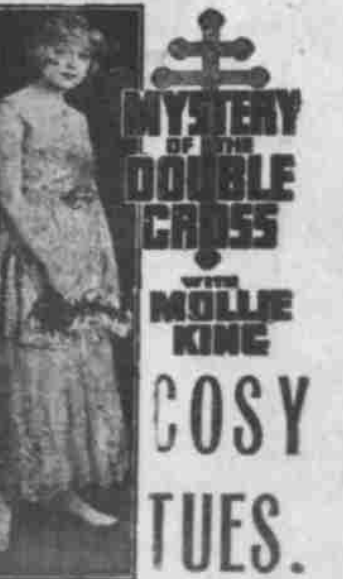
