## WEST END PARK PROVIDED FOR

Civic Club Will Beautify Triangular Piece at Corner of West Webb and Chestnut Streets.

To provide a small park for the west end of the city out of the triangular piece of property at the corner of West Webb and Chestnut streets will be an undertaking of the Civic Club which has already provided several parks for the city. The property in question belonged to the Northern Pacific but that company has refused to pay the paving liens against it. The city attorney was instructed by the council last evening to bring foreclosure proceedings at once.

Mrs. E. T. Wade, Mrs. J. F. Robinson and Mrs. Laura D. Nash appeared before the council last evening and asked permission to level the tract, plant trees and turn it over this year to some one who would put it in garden. Later, when the need for foodstuffs is not so great, the Civic Club will sow it to lawn. The city gave its permission and the permission of the N. P. will be secured by the city attorney.

Mrs. Nash asked the city to pass an ordinance preventing the building of garages which shut off the front view of any adjoining property but was advised the council has no such power.
