ALIENS AS WELL AS U. S. CITIZENS MUST MAKE REGISTRATION

Will Not Be Drafted for the Army But Government Desires a Record of Them; Misleading Answers Will Bring Fine.

PORTLAND, May 21.—Registration booths will be open throughout Oregon from 7 o'clock a. m. to 3 o'clock p. m. on war census day for the registration of all male residents between the ages of 21 and 30 years, inclusive.

In practically all cases, these registration booths will correspond to the regular precinct voting places.

It should be thoroughly understood that every male resident between the ages of 21 and 30 years, inclusive, must register.

This applies to aliens as well as to citizens. It makes no difference whether the alien is a Japanese, a Chinese, an Italian, a German, or a man of any other nationality. He must register, in common with all citizens of the designated ages.

Of course, aliens will not be drafted for the army. But the government desires a record of them. One purpose of the war census is to obtain accurate data as to the number and employment of aliens of military age now in the United States.

The government desires also to obtain from the coming census information showing exactly how every male citizen is best fitted to be of service to his country, whether in civil or military life.

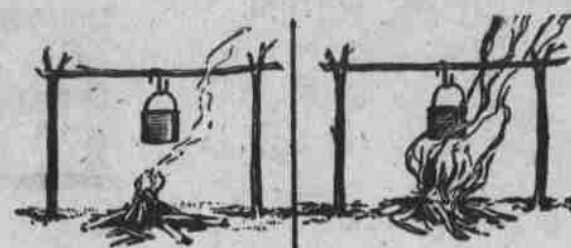
Consequently if you are a man between the ages of 21 and 30 years, inclusive, either alien or full citizen, you are subject to registration on the day fixed by the president. Exemptions from military service will be determined afterward. You must register in your home precinct. If you fail to present yourself, or presenting yourself, give false, misleading or incorrect answers to the questions, you are subject to punishment by imprisonment in jail. There is no alternative of fine.
